A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Quilting Friends:

We got our steps in as we went from very big room to very big room for our classes, lunch, meeting and show and tell. The classes were well received, and everyone achieved their quilting goal for the day. Thank you, Jan Farrow, for finding us such a great location, planning our lunch and providing a great experience for all.

One change I'd like to make next meeting is to view our Community Service quilts during Show and Tell. You work so hard on making and finishing our ALS quilts, we should see them. Let's try this: instead of handing them to Karin during the day when they go into bags until she processes them (I'm not minimalizing that – it is a lot), let's keep them until Show and Tell when we can applaud them and you, as you deserve. We will then find some volunteers to fold and bag them properly. Don't forget to label these quilts so you and VCQ can be properly acknowledged.

We pause our normal quilting to mark the passing of a long time VCQ member, Dianne Reasons. She was an integral part of VCQ as Membership Coordinator from 2007-2011 and 2015. She was the Shenandoah Valley Area Rep from 2012-2014 and served as fill-in Secretary when the Secretary was out sick. Although unable to participate for a while, she stitched herself into our organization and left her mark.

Our next in-person General Membership Meeting will be in Staunton on June 14, 2025. We are looking forward to learning from local teachers and a special treat from the Virginia Quilt Museum. We support the museum and they support us right back. Elsewhere in this newsletter are details on the day. Make your choices wisely: you want to be in the right class and indulging in the best lunch. So much rides on those choices.

Deb Schupp is leading the effort to update our Policies and Procedures. The last update was interrupted by Covid-19. Once we were operational again, the world had changed and we can't use those perfect words from before. Your Board is going through the P&P's, adapting them to our new virtual world on ZOOM. Our aim is to have the document for your approval at the Annual Meeting in October.

Also at the Annual Meeting in October, we will vote to elect new officers to the Board. If you have some ideas or preferences, please let me know. I am very open to suggestions.

MINUTES OF THE LAST GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING

VCQ General Membership Meeting in Fredericksburg, VA Saturday March 15, 2025

VCQ President: Kathy Gray, called the meeting to order at 12:48 pm. She welcomed everyone. The President announced that there will be a new Block of the Month program. It will be 12 blocks with two extra blocks. The blocks will be posted on the "**Members Only**" section of the website on the second Saturday of each month. Along with the block, eight of them will also have layouts. The directions for the blocks are in chart form so you can make any size block that you want. If this is new to you, come to one of the six "**Come Quilt With Me**" sessions any month and it can be explained to you.

President announced that we will need to vote in October for the slate of officers. We are looking for Vice President, Treasurer, and Membership. Please let her or someone on the board know if you are interested in any of those positions. President also announced that we are still looking for a Charlottesville/Lynchburg area rep. If you live in the area and are interested, please let her know.

Vice President: Karilyn Pittman thanked Jan Farrow for getting us into Fredericksburg and the use of the school. She welcomed new members who were in attendance for their 1st in-person meeting. Each new member received a gift: Sherry Brockman, Linda Billard, Beth Smelter, Shelley Norris, Pamela Harris, Diana Behling, Darlene Shamus, Ruth Pierce, Barbara Linde, Liz Phillips, and Katey Mostoller from **"Get Stitched Fabrics**".

Treasurer: Constance Horne presented the budget for 2025. The budget was published with a note in the newsletter to find it on the "Members Only" section of the VCQ website. The Board approved it to be presented to membership. The motion was made to accept the 2025 Budget by Karan Fisher. Mary Grogan seconded the motion. The motion passed and the 2025 Budget was accepted.

Secretary: President Gray announced that the October 2024 General Meeting minutes were also published in the January 2025 Newsletter and corrected by the Board. She asked if there were any other corrections. There were none so the minutes stand as published.

Membership: Faye Hannah announced that we have 239 members. Of those, 24 are new members who joined in 2025. President Kathy Gray also thanked Faye for setting up the New Year's Eve mystery virtual program. It was enjoyed by all who attended.

Historian: Kitty Bull has been working on photos from the 1990's and getting them onto a flash drive as well as stored on the cloud. She is working on a list of all Celebration teachers as well. She is going to try to get all this information set up so it will be accessible to members.

Virtual Programs: Kathy Hippeli reported that the February program with MJ Kinman had about 40 people attend. She is working on another online program for September 6th. She is a member of Global Quilt Connections so that will give her insight to new teachers that we can use.

In-Person Programs: Jan Farrow announced that we will meet in Staunton on June 14th. They are working on Culpeper for October 25th. Today's in-person meeting has 64 attendees, 3 of which are non-members. Debi Harding announced that the Virginia Quilt Museum, in Dayton, is about 30 minutes from Staunton and Alicia Thomas is going to host a little gathering on the front porch from 5:30-7:30pm on Friday night. She will have some small snacks and you can tour the museum. **Patchwork Plus** quilt shop is about 1.2 miles (4 minutes) from the museum and closes at 4pm on Friday. Addresses for the meeting location will be added to the VCQ website **"Calendar**" and suggestions for lodging will be in the next newsletter, so meeting attendees can look for hotels in the area.

Newsletter: Kitty Bull announced that the deadline for the next newsletter is April 15th for the June In-Person meeting and then August 15th for the upcoming Fall Programs and Membership meeting. Please send your articles in so she and Mary Grogan can get the newsletter put together to be released.

Technology: Tammy Halstead announced that she is aware there have been some technical issues when signing up for meetings or workshops. If you have any issues, please reach out to info@vcq.org and Tammy can help with it. The new website should be up soon thanks to the Team of volunteers helping with the transition: Mary Grogan, Constance Horne, Kathy Hippeli, and Debi Harding. Tammy asked that guild members let her know of any of their local quilt shops that have information to be updated on the website. Tammy also let members know that they are updating the area map for the roster.

Publicity: Kelly Zuber let Area Reps know that they will get more rack cards at the June in-person meeting if they need them.

Celebration 2026: Kelly Zuber explained, for members who are not aware, that Celebration is a 4-day, all-inclusive retreat with workshops at Smith Mountain Lake. It will be held from Thursday, April 16th to Sunday, April 19th2026. Kelly introduced volunteers and that "Americana" is the theme. On July 4th, the brochure will be published online. On August 1st member sign-up will open. On September 1st, non-member signups will be opened. The Quilt Challenge committee is Kitty Bull, Kathy Hippeli, Susan Fulton and Heidi Hayes. The theme for the challenge is **Stars & Stripes Forever.** The fabric can have stars or stripes and does NOT have to be red, white or blue. Sign up will be online or with the form that is in the newsletter. Kelly asked that if you are entering into the Challenge, please make sure to register so they know how much room will be needed to display the quilts. Kelly Zuber also explained Block Lotto. Kits are made available for purchase and contain one piece of focus fabric. You add to it and bring your completed block to Celebration for a drawing to win blocks. Karan Fisher is the member in charge of Block Lotto. Karan presented the design. It will be Dresden plates.

They will be freestyle, can have different edges, and be different sizes. If you purchase the kit it will contain: 1 fat quarter of either star or stripe fabric and a paper template for both a large Dresden and a small Dresden blade. The kit will be able to make 2 plates. The kits will be sold at the June in-person meeting. If there are any left, then members may purchase an additional kit. Kelly announced that they are looking for more help with getting materials together for the teachers gifts. If interested, please let her know.

Kelly announced she will also need to get with each area rep to get some donations from their area. She will provide a letter to take to quilt shops. Items will be needed by the June in-person meeting.

Community Service: Karin McElvein was absent so Debi Harding presented. She announced she was picking up any quilts and forms to go with them. She also has patterns and kits made up in **Come Quilt With Me** for members to pick up and make the quilts. She is looking for some volunteers to also quilt completed tops. She would like to get back any kits signed out today at the June in-person meeting so she can turn them in by July 2026. July is the deadline and the year starts over August 1, 2026. She reminded everyone that the quilt size needs to be 45" x 60".

President, Kathy Gray, reminded the membership that we get rewarded based on how many quilts we turn in. It is a competition so let's come in at #1. She suggested that if you have made a quilt in a class and maybe it isn't one that you particularly care for, donate that to ALS.

Area Reps: President Kathy Gray introduced the area reps: Debi Harding-Tidewater/Southside, Sue Knapp-Peninsula, Paula Golden-Southwest, Susan Fulton-Fredericksburg, Barbara Vonada-Richmond, Janice Willis-Culpeper/Madison, Heidi Haynes-Shenandoah Valley, and Kathy Gray-Northern Virginia. We are still looking for an area rep for Charlottesville/Lynchburg. If you are interested please reach out and let us know.

President Kathy Gray pointed out the Memory Tree quilt which has a leaf for each VCQ member who has passed away and also the VCQ Banner.

President reminded everyone to be back in the auditorium at 3:30pm for Show & Tell and door prizes.

Meeting was adjourned at 1:50pm.

Thank you to all the members making quilts for the Hopes and Dreams Quilt Challenge for ALS.

Quilters Dream Batting has held annual competition continue the fight to find a cure. They provide an entry form in each package of batting purchased. VCQ has the form on our website to print, complete and pin to each quilt. Just make sure you circle the entry category of "Quilt Guild". The minimum completed size. requested by ALS, is 45" x 60" or larger lap and bed size welcome.

Your name and address is used to receive a personal hand-written note of thanks from Quilters Dream Batting.

Quilts are delivered to ALS patients nationwide, also auctioned, raffled or sold. VCQ competes each year to give the most generous quilts from a Guild. 1st prize is \$1,000, 2nd place \$750 and 3rd \$500 all in prizes given to VCQ. We typically receive lots of batting to use in the quilts. The year ends JULY 31st. So let's push to return as many tops, quilted tops or completed quilts at the June 14, 2025 meeting.

At the March 15 meeting in Fredericksburg, Faye Hannah & Debi Harding cut kits and put together 30+ kits with about 4 yards each of fabric and handed out 3-yard quilt patterns. Most were signed out by members. Thank you! We also collected 13 completed quilts to deliver to Hopes & Dreams. We also gave out 15 cuts of batting to members for machine quilting at home. Thank you to all members who long arm quilt for us.

In March, Quilters Studio in Fairfax gave VCQ an annual donation of 51, one yard cuts of fabric to use for charity. Karin will be giving this fabric out at the June & October VCQ in person meetings. When visiting Quilters Studio, please say a special "Thank You" for their generous donation.

VCQ will be meeting **IN-PERSON June 14, 2025 in Staunton, VA**. The schedule for the day includes three GREAT workshops to choose from and a Come Quilt with Me (CQWM) option for your personal sewing machine or handwork.

<u>Meeting Location</u>: Memorial Baptist Church, 224 Taylor St, Staunton, VA 24401 <u>Lodging Accommodations</u>: VCQ does not block rooms, so we hope you will call and ask for a discount at the hotels close to the venue. Linda Boone is a fabric collector who occasionally cuts it up to make quilts, bags, and other art projects. Currently the





Rotary cutter

Rotary ruler, 3" x 12" (roughly)

1 sheet of template plastic
60 degree triangle (optional)
Double sided tape
Pins
Scissors
Paper scissors

"Stringing Along" – Learn how easy and addicting string piecing can be! Choose from 2 designs to create your own masterpiece using "Strings" of fabric. This technique uses strips of fabric from 1" to 2" wide and anything in between!

String Piecing is a wonderful way to use up scraps and at the same time conjure up memories. Everyone has scraps from past projects or that we acquired from our quilting friends. In this class, students will learn what constitutes a "string", how to make a basic String Quilt, and an easy way to make String Quilts using half square triangles. The design possibilities are endless.

The quilt does not have to be red, white, and blue. Quilt must be made in 2025 or 2026. Quilt must include three layers – front, batting, and backing but can use any technique. Quilt must include a 4" hanging sleeve sewn in the top. Quilters are strongly encouraged to make quilts 70" or less. Quilts over 70" by 70" must be entered by March 1, 2026, and all others by April 10, 2026. See more details of this fun quilt challenge on page 22 below.

All Celebration 2026 participants will vote for Best in Show and Best Interpretation of Theme. First, second, and third place ribbons will be presented in both categories.

<u>Celebration 2026 Quilt Challenge - "Stars And Stripes Forever"</u>

Okay, Folks, **Who** doesn't love a good contest to compete for winning fame, ribbons, and recognition? The Celebration 2026 Team challenges you to interpret this year's theme, **"Americana."**

In 1976, the bicentennial helped to revive the art of quilting. Hopefully we will see interest grow celebrating the 250th year anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence. Think beyond Red, White, and Blue. Think Purple Mountains **Striped** Majesty or **Stars** in My Eyes Over the Mississippi! Use your quilter's creative juices to create what Celebration 2026's theme comes to mind for you!

Additional Guidelines:

- 1 The quilt must have stars or stripes or both. The stars or stripes or both can be in the pattern, in the fabric, or both and can be any color. It can be all stars or all stripes or a combination.
- Quilts may be any size. Please use the Quilt Entry form and submit by April 10, 2026 for quilts up to size 70"x70". Please submit Quilt Entry form by March 1, 2026 if it will be over 70"x70".
- 3 Your quilt must be made with a top and bottom layer, and batting in between with stitching holding it together.
- 4 Your quilt may be pieced or appliqued, modern or traditional. Any technique is acceptable. Other than that, it is all up to you and your imagination!
- 5 Your quilt must have a label sewn on the back bottom left hand corner with at least your name, the quilt's name, and the date completed. (this will be covered up for anonymity during competition)
- **6** Your quilt must have a sleeve sewn on the back with a 4" wide hanging sleeve in order to slide it onto the display frame. For heavy quilts and quilts wider than 80" you may consider making a split sleeve if it needs additional frame support.
- **7** Each Celebration participant can enter ONE quilt which must have been completed in 2025 or 2026.

This will be a "Viewer's Choice" competition. There will be award ribbons for the Best in Show - First, Second and Third place AND Best Interpretation of Theme – First, Second and Third place quilts as determined by the Celebration! 2026 attendees. We are asking each Celebration participant entering a challenge quilt to complete a pre-entry form with basic information.

Deadline for this entry form will be two weeks before Celebration 2026. Turn in your completed quilt at on-site registration on Thursday by 4:00 pm, April 23, 2026, so we will have time to set up the display. Your creation must be registered and numbered so the Celebration attendees will have a chance to vote for their favorite challenge interpretation.

VCQ Celebration 2026 Block Lotto & Dresden Plate Quilt Block History

Are you ready for VCQ Celebration 2026? Are you informed about the When? What? Where? and How? of everything to do with VCQ Celebration 2026? Regardless of whether you are "in the know", or if you have or have not experienced a VCQ Celebration at



Smith Mountain Lake, VA; the VCQ Celebration 2026 Committee is beginning to publicize/inform you of this well attended and exciting bi-annual event. To kick things off, let me share with you information about the BLOCK LOTTO opportunity offered to those who plan to attend or register for VCQ Celebration 2026. BLOCK LOTTO is like Block of the Month but is solely for Celebration. At inperson meetings, kits will be available for purchase of \$5.00 beginning June 14, 2025 meeting. This year's BLOCK LOTTO is the Dresden Plate quilt block. Kits will contain a FQ of focus fabric, 2 paper wedge templates and instructions to make the Dresden Plates. Examples of

"reimagined" Dresden Plates will also be on display at all the in-person meetings.

Whether you are a seasoned or beginner quilter, you may have heard of the Dresden Plate quilt block, but do you know its' history? I didn't until I did some research about the origin of this quilt block. (references: https://www.oldest.org/culture/quilt-patterns/; https://ronatheribbiter.com/dresden-block-history/) I supposed, thinking like everyone else, the quilt block got its' name from the Dresden Porcelain Plates that were originated in

Dresden, Germany during the Victorian Era. Well, I was greatly mistaken! The porcelain Dresden Plate itself had little to do with the quilt block we know & love today; instead, the "trademark" on the bottom of these plates most likely connects the Dresden porcelain plates to the Dresden Plate quilt block. The only other thing that connects the two is the name of Dresden, which is more of a statement of the Dresden Style or artistic movement of romanticism or "art deco" in the 1800's. Many of the famed Dresden porcelain pieces were created by a group of painters: Karl Richard Klemm, Donath & Co.,



Oswald Lorenz and Adolf Hamman. These painters did not make the porcelain themselves, but rather purchased the porcelain created in nearby Meissen then painted their artwork on top. This group of painters, to set their work apart from so many porcelain artists, created and registered their own mark or "trademark" called the famous blue crown Dresden porcelain mark. Much of the original work and records of the Dresden porcelain plate are lost to history because of the allied bombings of WWII. But, it is known that the original blue crown mark included 2 or 3 "petals".




The Dresden Plate Fan goes back as far as the 1800's and were mostly made from wool, then later of cotton. They were hand pieced and appliqued onto a fabric square background block. Eventually, four of the fans were put together to make the full Dresden Plate quilt block we use today. The Dresden Plate quilt block really didn't become popular until the 1920's and were predominantly made from feedsack material. It is considered one of the oldest quilt patterns and is ranked #8 on the list of "Oldest Quilt Patterns"





Remembering One of Our Own
