CELEBRATION 2022 – FAQs

What does it cost? What is included?

VCQ Members: \$385; Non-members: \$485; Day Students VCQ member \$310; Non-members: \$410. Visit the web site at www.vcq.org/join.htm to become a member. Includes lodging, meals, all workshops (except kit fees & supplies), lectures, and special events.

What is the Vi Graves Celebration Scholarship?

The Vi Graves Celebration Scholarship provides financial support for VCQ members to attend the biennial event. Vi was a VCQ member who loved Celebration and lost her life to cancer. Scholarships can be full or partial depending on need and funds available. Applications are submitted to the VCQ President who along with the VP will determine the number and dollar amount of scholarships granted. This process is confidential. A member can nominate another member by submitting their name to the President or submitting a completed form on their behalf. The deadline for submission of the application for a Celebration scholarship is February 1, 2022. Application on page 30.

How do I register?

Online registration will begin August 1, 2021 at www.vcq.org. Your \$100 non-refundable deposit must accompany your registration (via PayPal). The deposit reserves your space and will be deducted from the total cost. Choose your first-choice classes; if a class is full, you will be prompted to make another choice. Members only may register in August; non-members may register beginning in September. Mailed registrations will be processed according to the date they were postmarked. If you prefer to register by mail, please send deposit payable to VCQ (notation: Celebration 2022) and registration form to: Kathy McCrea, 3852 Persimmon Circle, Fairfax, VA 22031. Registration closes March 1, 2022 or earlier if capacity is reached. Contact Kathy: kathy.mccrea@cox.net.

When is final payment due?

What is the cancellation policy?

While the deposit will not be refunded, refunds of additional payments will be issued only for requests postmarked or emailed before February 1, 2022, due to commitments to the 4-H Center and teachers.

What about lodging?

Housing is dormitory style in rooms accommodating a maximum of 4; each room has a private bath with shower, heat and air-conditioning, and ample storage. A limited number of handicapped facilities are available. Please indicate your needs when you register. Refrigerators and ice machines are available in the dormitories. There will be a three-person minimum, four-person maximum per room. PLEASE INDICATE YOUR ROOMMATES' NAMES/PREFERENCES WHEN REGISTERING. (4th bed is a trundle so please keep this in mind when selecting your roommates). SML 4-H Center is a non-smoking facility. Bed linens, pillow, blanket and towels will be provided. If desired, you may bring a bathmat, extra towel, extra pillow, hangers, and quilt for your bed.

Celebration 2022 Quilt Challenge:

"Quilt Trails" Who doesn't have a story to tell about their quilt journey or trail? Tell your story in this Celebration 2022 Challenge quilt contest. Quilts will be displayed at Celebration and there will be several Viewers' Choice Awards. All genres of quilting - traditional, modern, pieced, applique, and art are acceptable. Guidelines are simple.

- 1. 16" square or a perimeter of 64 inches. In other words, perhaps a rectangle 12' X 20" to give the perimeter of 64"
- 2. Must consist of 3 layers guilted.
- 3. Embellishments may be used but if hanging from the edges, they must fall within the perimeter guidelines.
- 4. Please have a hanging sleeve and label your quilt with Maker's Name, address and date.
- 5. The deadline for this challenge is check-in on April 28, 2022 at **Celebration 2022!**

Barbara has been sewing since she was a young girl and has been making quilts for more than 35 years. Her interest, skills and love for quilt making make her a dedicated quilt teacher. She has taught quilting since 1989 at local quilt shops, guilds and quilt shows throughout the US. She is a featured guest artist on The Quilt Show with Alex Anderson and Ricky Tims. Over the years, Barbara has won many ribbons, including Best of Show in four shows. She has had four quilts accepted in the AQS Paducah show. She is also known for her complex feathered star medallion quilts. In 2014 Barbara was honored to have her quilt Red and White—By the Numbers, selected as the Commemorative Quilt for the 40th anniversary of International Quilt Festival Houston. It appeared in international advertising, throughout the city of Houston and was featured on the beautiful tote bags and show pins. The quilt is now part of the Quilts Incorporated Corporate Collection. Barbara has also been an Education Team member with Quilts Inc. for more than 20 years. She has had many quilts published in magazines and the book 500 Traditional Quilts. Beyond her quilting life, Barbara enjoys spending time with her husband and two grown sons and her grandchildren, gardening, reading and traveling.

Suzi's interest in quilting history led her to fascination with barn quilts, which she discovered on a cross-country camping trip in 2008. A high school English teacher, Suzi spent two years documenting the barn quilt movement, traveling to twenty-nine states, gathering stories of these painted quilt patterns and their ties to family and tradition. The resulting book, "Barn Quilts and the American Quilt Trail Movement," was published by Ohio University Press in 2012. The success of "Barn Quilts" led to a second book, "Following the Barn Quilt Trail," published in April of 2016. Suzi gives talks on barn quilts to quilting groups, libraries, and other civic organizations. Her barn quilt painting workshops have added over three thousand quilt blocks to the landscape, from California to Massachusetts. Suzi and her husband, Glen, left Georgia behind in 2013, in their RV and have called the road their home since. They return to the South each year to celebrate the holidays with family and to spend time kayaking on their favorite Georgia and Florida rivers.



Workshop #101

Barbara Black - 5 Easy Pieces

BEG

Replicate this circa 1875 quilt with your choice of reproduction or contemporary fabrics. Learn several ways to make flying geese, design your quilt with careful color placement or randomly. Improve your piecing as you learn lots of tips and tricks.

Kit fee: \$6.00 (includes handout/pattern and paper patterns to make 16 sets of geese)

Supply list:

Sewing Machine with all required items, power cord, foot control, etc. Bring an extra sewing machine needle, you never know.

Basic Sewing Kit

FABRICS: bring less for smaller quilt, sample is queen-size

LIGHT Version – photo on previous page; this uses one fabric for all the light pieces (but could also be scrappy):

Light Background - 7 yards, this includes outer border--6 yards if not adding Flying Geese Borders **Geese**: total of 3 yards, fat quarters make it scrappy

DARK Version – photo below; this uses a wide variety of dark prints and one large featured print:

Big Print - 8" squares and perimeter triangles--3 yards

Geese - 3 -4 yards, fat quarters make it scrappy Background for Geese - 2-3 yards, more fat quarters

Blocks at intersections - 1/4 yard--again, be scrappy

Tools:

- 6.5" square ruler, or similar size
- Add-a-Quarter Ruler, 6" length works well.
- Quality thread for piecing, Masterpiece or Aurifil, neutral like gray or tan



Workshop #102

In this class you will learn how to construct a Brimfield Block, using English Paper Piecing. This is a hand stitching method for completing the blocks, which are then machine or hand appliqued onto the background fabric. These blocks are a bit different than your conventional EPP projects, as our papers feature perforation which provides a wide variety of design. Our acrylic templates are specifically designed to accommodate the perforated paper pieces, and therefore it is strongly suggested that you bring a set to use. We have listed what you will need to bring to the class. At the end, we have listed the brands and types of notions that we prefer.

Required Supplies:

- Class Kit: (pattern + papers for 1 block) \$19
- Glue Pen or Glue Stick
- Needles
- Thread: light and dark, or match to your fabric (80wt recommended) (all supplies listed above are available for purchase from Brimfield Awakening)
- Scissors thread snips & fabric
- Pen and/or pencil (to trace templates onto fabric)

Optional Supplies:

- Acrylic Templates (either the regular or window acrylics) https://brimfieldawakening.com/shop/
- Wonder Clips or Sew Tites
- Blue painter's tape
- Colored pencils (to sketch out a design on the coloring sheets)
- Needle Threader
- Thread Conditioner
- Fussy Cutting Mirror
- Thimble

Fabric: Generally, we suggest bringing 4 Fat Quarters for a block. We suggest pulling fabrics that play well together. Bring a wide assortment of your favorites! Fabrics with a pattern repeat or stripes often work well for fussy cutting. Because fussy cutting requires more fabric, we suggest making sure that you can cut out at least 4 of what you like about the design – so, you may need a cut larger than a FQ. However, if you do not want to fussy cut your fabric, then smaller cuts will work as well. Other options are:

~assorted scraps – you will need pieces that are 5"x7", 3.5"x5", and 3.5"x4"

You will also need:

- ~15"x15" square for your background
- ~Optional: 9.5"x9.5" square if you elect to include a center piece

Note from teachers: Our templates are available with two seam allowance options: ¼" and 3/8". Both options are available for sale on our website. Our Window templates are also available with both seam allowance options. For EPP we recommend the 3/8" seam allowance. The teachers will have any needed supplies available for sale in class, but you can also

order online ahead of time and have the items delivered to you in class. If you choose this option, it's important to leave a note on your order that you want the items delivered in class. Workshop #103

Gyleen Fitzgerald - Over & Under Rainbow

ALL

Modern with a twist! "KNOT" as hard as you think! It's visually dynamic with fast easy piecing. Don't let cutting "Tie" you up. All you need is one 2.5" strip set and 3.5 yards of background. Workshop project is a 56" x 70" lap quilt, however doing less makes a wonderful table or bed runner. Project looks modern with solid or semi-solid or batik fabric. Select a background fabric that doesn't compete with your strips. If you have a collection of self-made $2\frac{1}{2}$ strips, go for scrappy. I used my light $2\frac{1}{2}$ strips for a scrappy background. Don't over think it. Come to have fun.

Fabric Requirements:

- (42) 2½" x 40" strips, assorted fabrics (solids, semi-solids, batiks) (2 strips per each fabric)
- 3½ yards background fabric (note: 4 yards of background fabric is needed if you want a border.)

Homework: Cut (12) 2½" x 40" strips from background fabric.

Special Tool: Angle Trim Plus Tool (\$20) http://colourfulstitches-com.3dcartstores.com/ Instructions: Pattern (\$10) http://colourfulstitches-com.3dcartstores.com/Patterns_c_14-2.html (Gyleen will have tools & patterns available for purchase in class if you want to save shipping.

General Supplies:

- Sewing machine with manual; BSK
- 1/4" foot without edge guide (if possible)
- (2) thread colors, one for the top and another in the bobbin that is visible on the wrong side of fabric
- seam ripper and thread snips
- rotary cutter, ruler and mat
- extension cord
- straight pins
- finger pressing tool
- batting to use as a design wall (optional).

Ready to dip your toes into some improvisational piecing? This fun and whimsical quilt is a great starting point. 9 blocks come together to make the sampler. Or, each block can be a new quilt in itself. If you're ready to let go and play, this is for you! Finished size: 36" x 36"

Kit fee: \$12 includes pattern and freezer paper for templates.

Supplies:

- Sewing machine with all its parts & manual; BSK
- 8-10 fat quarters of assorted prints (solids, reads as solids, small or medium scale)
- 1 ½ yards background fabric
- ½ yard binding fabric (If you'd like to make a scrappy binding, cut a 2 ½"x 22" strip from each fat quarter. Set aside for binding.)
- 1 ½ yards backing fabric
- Batting, at least 45" x 45"
- 14" square of freezer paper
- Mechanical pencil
- 12 ½" square ruler

Workshop #105

Patty Murphy – Aether Quilt

ALL

All the drama in this quilt! Big floral prints are brought to life against a background of ombréd fabric to create a masterpiece. This is a quilt you want to wrap yourself in while on a bed or a sofa. This quilt is easy to assemble - the most difficult part is arranging the orange peels and background pieces to your liking. This quilt really lets value and hue do all the work! This class is all about color and fabric placement. We will talk about how to use the prints to transition from one color to another so the ombré fabrics and orange peels blend seamlessly to create smooth transitions from color to color. Orange peels are appliqued (machine or hand) over background squares.

Quilt Size: 70" x 70" Lap Size: 40" x 55" Table Runner Size:

Pattern fee: \$12, best to buy on my website ahead of time

Supply List:

- Sewing machine with BSK.
- You will need a copy of my Aether Quilt pattern (available on my website, www.pattymurphyhandmade.com)
- The pattern includes a paper Orange Peel template you can print. The template is sized for machine appliqué but you can cut it larger for needle turn. An acrylic template is available for purchase on my website. The acrylic template includes a ¼" seam allowance.

For a 70" x 70" quilt:

- o (100) 5 " x 11" rectangles for your Orange Peels
- O I used 100 different florals in my quilt. You can fussy cut from yardage to get multiple Orange Peels shapes/color variations from one piece, you can repeat fabrics, you can cut Orange Peels from large or small floral print yardage or cut Orange Peels from larger scraps. Please bring extra fabric for orange peels to class to cut more as we work to put it all together. Please make sure that your orange peels have a good variety of colors (remember ROYGBIV: red, orange, yellow, green, blue, indigo, violet) so we can use the floral fabrics to create a rainbow on your quilt top.
- o One ½ yard bundle of Jennifer Sampou's Sunrise SKY Ombré fabrics
- One ½ yard bundle of Jennifer Sampou's Sunset SKY Ombré fabrics
 (www.jennifersampou.com, click on her store link at the top -OR-
- 42 10 ½"" squares for background pieces PLUS 8" x WOF strips for the side setting and corner square triangles in the colors of your choosing.
- Another source of gradated fabrics is Fabric Dyer Vicki Welsh; you can find her fabrics at www.colorwaysbyvicki.com

For a 40" x 55" quilt:

- o (48) 5 " x 11" rectangles for your Orange Peels.
- You can fussy cut from yardage to get multiple Orange Peels shapes/color variations from one piece, you can repeat fabrics, you can cut Orange Peels from large or small floral print yardage or cut Orange Peels from larger scraps. Please bring extra fabric for orange peels to class to cut more as we work to put it all together.
- Please make sure that your orange peels have a good variety of colors (remember: ROYGBIV) so we can use the floral fabrics to create a rainbow on your quilt top.
- 12 half yard cuts of an assortment of Jennifer Sampou's Sunrise or Sunset SKY Ombré fabrics (web address above)
 OR-
- 18 10 ½" squares for background pieces PLUS 8" x WOF strips for the side setting and corner square triangles in the colors of your choosing.
- Another source of gradated fabrics is Fabric Dyer Vicki Welsh; you can find her fabrics at www.colorwaysbyvicki.com

For a Table Runner:

- o (16) 5 " x 11" rectangles for your Orange Peels.
- You can fussy cut from yardage to get multiple Orange Peels shapes/color variations from one piece, you can repeat fabrics, you can cut Orange Peels from large or small floral print yardage or cut Orange Peels from larger scraps. Please bring extra fabric for orange peels to class to cut more as we work to put it all together.
- Please make sure that your orange peels have a good variety of colors (remember: ROYGBIV) so we can use the floral fabrics to create a rainbow on your quilt top.
- 3 half yard cuts of an assortment of Jennifer Sampou's Sunrise or Sunset SKY Ombré fabrics (web address above)
 -OR-
- 4 10 ½"" squares for background pieces PLUS 8" x WOF strips for the side setting and corner square triangles in the colors of your choosing.
- Another source of gradated fabrics is Fabric Dyer Vicki Welsh; you can find her fabrics at www.colorwaysbyvicki.com

- Regardless of the Orange Peel appliqué method you choose to use, please have your
 Orange Peels cut out before class so we can maximize our time together.
- If you plan to needle turn appliqué the Orange Peels, cut out the Orange Peel shapes using the acrylic template or the paper template included in the pattern. Be sure to add a seam allowance to the Orange Peel if you use the paper template.
- If you plan to fuse the Orange Peels, please have the fusible secured (fused) to the back of each Orange Peel shape, being sure to follow manufacturer instructions. You can use the paper template or the acrylic template to trace the Orange Peel shape on the fusible web. In class, I will show you my shortcut to trim the Orange Peels to fit if you use the acrylic template, so don't worry that it's slightly larger than the paper template included in the instructions.
- Bring extra fusible in case you change some of the orange peels.
- Bring extra floral fabrics for additional Orange Peels because color placement will move and change. You will more than likely cut a few more out as we put the pieces together.
- If you can, please bring a piece of flannel or batting to use as a design wall.

Workshop #106

Suzi Parron - Barn Quilt Painted Block

ALL

You will begin with a pre-primed board and go through each step—drafting, taping, and painting, with careful attention to detail. I have plenty of patterns already drafted for you! You will leave with a finished quilt block, ready to hang. The finished product will be two-by-two feet and is the perfect size for mounting on smaller buildings. Note that we will be painting. It is not really messy, but there is some chance you will get paint on your clothing. Dress accordingly or bring an apron!

Supplies provided for Kit Fee of \$35 include:

- Pre-primed 2 by 2-foot board. The priming is a two-day job, which is already done for you
- Suggested patterns ready to transfer (you may bring your own, but keep it simple— and be ready to draw it onto the board)
- Exterior latex paint
- Foam brushes
- Knives/scissors for cutting tape

Supplies to Bring:

- Painter's tape--Green "Frog" brand is BY FAR the best, but blue Scotch tape will do. Narrower tape (about 1 inch) is preferred
- Yardstick or 24-inch ruler
- Pencil
- Blow dryer for every 3-4 people (extension cord could be helpful)

Marisela Rumberg - Quilt Your Own Quilts (Machine Quilting 1 & 2) ALL

In this workshop Marisela will teach you all her tips and secrets for you to be able to quilt your own quilts at home on your domestic sewing machine. Learn the difference between Walking Foot Quilting and Free Motion Quilting and never be scared again of ruining your quilt tops. The Walking Foot can be used for so much more than just 'stitch in the ditch'. Marisela will show you how to use this foot in all its potential to get great results. Also, you will learn to quilt your tops with more than straight lines! Flowers, spirals, leaves, hearts, feathers and more will be taught with Free Motion Quilting and you will do all that without marking your quilt at all. Marisela's trademark technique, "Free Motion Quilting is Brain Training" has given many who felt intimidated by Free Motion Quilting the confidence to enjoy being creative. She will share her technique with you and you will see how easy it is to train your brain. You will start loving Free Motion Quilting as much as she does.

SUPPLY LIST:

Sewing machine with:

- Walking foot (also called Even Feed Foot).
- Spring action Free Motion Quilting foot.
- 2 Bobbins with 100% Cotton thread, 50 weight, light color (I recommend Aurifil brand).
- Quilting thread in dark color, 40 or 30 weight (I recommend King-Tut brand by Superior Threads)
- Quilting Needles or Topstitch needles Size 90/14. You must know how to operate your own machine. (Don't forget to bring your machine's power cord and pedal).

Also bring:

- One quilt sandwich where the top is made with six 2½"x15" light colors fabric strips pieced together. Use muslin for the back. Thin or medium loft batting. Can be spray basted or not basted at all.
- Five 15" quilt sandwiches, using muslin as top and back. Thin or medium loft batting. Can be spray basted or not basted at all.
- Quilting gloves in your size (I recommend Machingers brand)
- Basic Sewing Supplies (seam-ripper, scissors, pins...)

Optional - only if you have it:

- Extension table for your machine
- Straight Stitch plate
- Supreme Slider

Preparation Instructions


Practice Sandwiches Wash, starch and press all fabric. Make 12 practice quilt sandwiches to practice stitching designs. Baste with basting spray or use fusible batting. I like June Tailor's basting spray because a little is enough and it will not gum the needle. I like Quilters Dream fusible cotton and poly batting.

- Cotton fabric Cut twelve 8.5 inch x 8.5 inch pieces of solid, medium to dark fabric
- Batting of choice Cut twelve 10.5 inch x 10.5 inches pieces of batting

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
^{***}NOTE - Some supplies will be available for purchase in class ***

- Muslin for backing Cut twelve 10.5 inch x 10.5 inches pieces
- Mark –With a thin permanent marker, (an ink pen will work) mark each 8.5 x 8.5 fabric with a 6-inch square that has a ¼ inch border. NOTE: for best results mark fabric before making the quilt sandwich.



Large Quilt Panels prep:

- Quilters select one of two original designs on pre-printed panels (2 copies of design) to quilt;
 bring two cotton battings and two backings 14" x 14" OR
- Bring two 14" square quilt sandwiches of your own cotton fabric to quilt.

Workshop #201

Barbara Black – Kisses and Hugs (Japanese X and + Blocks)

ALL

A fun block to make, it looks new and fresh with bright colors. Each block uses 7 different fabrics, use whatever you like, scraps work! The class sample quilt is 45" x 60", a good throw-size or young person's quilt. Each block is 7.5" --you can plan your size to be whatever suits you. This makes a great baby quilt! Learn excellent cutting and sewing skills and you will be amazed how accurate your piecing is, especially where 4 seams meet.

Fabrics: Wide variety of fabrics, your choice, bright, repro or whatever you like: light, medium and dark. Scraps work well if you have a lot of them. Bring 14-21 Fat quarters if you don't want to use scraps, include light, medium and dark. Each block takes 7 fabrics, made from 2" strips and 3.5" squares. Pre-cutting some of your fabric in strips of 2" and 3.5" will save class time. NOTE: if you cut strips 4" you will be able to use that strip for all four of the positions, with little waste.

Supply List:

- Sewing Machine with all required items, power cord, foot control, etc. Bring an extra sewing machine needle, you never know.
- Basic Sewing Kit
- 2 rulers: 6" x 12" is good if working with fat quarters and scraps, longer ruler if using full-size fabrics. You also need a square, 8.5" is great size, smaller if that's what you have.
- Rotary cutter and Mat--18" x 24" if cutting full-size fabrics. IF YOU ARE ONLY USING FAT QUARTERS--you can use an 18" x 12" mat. Also very helpful is a turntable mat OR a small cutting mat, 8" x 10" or even smaller.
- Mechanical pencil for drawing lines on back of fabric
- Thread: I strongly recommend Masterpiece, Aurifil or Quilters Select 60 wt thread, it's fine and strong and will make a difference in your accuracy. Neutral color like gray or tan.

Workshop #202

Brimfield Awakenings (Kim Martucci and Nisha Bouri) - Brimfield Meadows ALL

In this class you will learn how to construct a Meadows Block, using English Paper Piecing. This is a hand stitching method for completing the blocks, which are then machine or hand appliqued onto the background fabric. These blocks are a bit different than your conventional EPP projects, as our papers feature perforation which provides a wide variety of design. Our acrylic templates are specifically designed to accommodate the perforated paper pieces, and therefore it is strongly suggested that you bring a set to use, or that you arrange to share with another classmate. We have listed what you will need to bring to the class.

Required Supplies:

- Meadows Class Kit (pattern and papers for 1 block) Price: \$21
- Glue Pen or Glue Stick
- Needles
- Thread: light and dark, or match to your fabric (80wt recommended)

(all supplies listed above are available for purchase from Brimfield Awakening)

- Scissors thread snips & fabric
- Pen and/or pencil (to trace templates onto fabric)

Optional Supplies:

Fabric Requirements:

Generally, we suggest bringing a combination of Fat Quarters and Fat Eighths for a block. We suggest pulling fabrics that play well together. Bring a wide assortment of your favorite! Fabrics with a pattern repeat or stripes often work well for fussy cutting. Because fussy cutting requires more fabric, we suggest bringing a larger cut of fabric.

We suggest bringing 5-10 FQs.

We have included the fabric sizes and quantities for 1 Brimfield Meadows Block:

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Piece A: 2.5" x 3.5" (quantity: 8)
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Piece B: 2" x 2.25" (quantity: 4)

Piece C: 2.25" x 2.25" (quantity: 4)

Piece D1: 3.5" x 3" (quantity: 8)

Piece D2: 4" x 3" (quantity: 8)

Piece D3: 3.5" x 3" (quantity: 8)

[OR, if you elect to leave piece D intact: 7" x 3" (quantity: 4)]

Piece E: 6"x4" (quantity: 4)

You will also need a 16"x16" square for your background. Fabric requirements for the whole quilt are available in the pattern.

Workshop #203

Gyleen Fitzgerald Glorified Nine Patch

ALL

Illusion at its best! But how do you get those curves? With straight lines of course. Go figure but it's just that simple. You take two relatively high contrasting colors, you alternate two pieced "quilter friendly" blocks then float segments into the border and just like that you're done! You will learn how to make pointy triangle segments with the Tri-Recs tool and how to artfully transition and color blend from one block to the next.

Fabric requirements:

- ~10 Fat Quarters for the feature fabric
- 2½ yards of background fabric

Special Tools:

- Tri-Recs Tool by Simplicity (There are several tools on the market very similar to this and any of them should work. Check your tools before you purchase, it is highly likely you have it it has 2 pieces, a skinny and a wide).
- Angle Trim Plus Tool (\$20) <u>Angle Trim Tool -SKU 305 (3dcartstores.com)</u>
- Pattern (\$10) Glorified Nine Patch Modern-SKU 259 (3dcartstores.com)
 (Gyleen will have tools & patterns available for purchase in class if you want to save shipping.)

General supplies:

- Sewing machine with manual
- 1/4" foot without edge guide (if possible)
- (2) thread colors, one for the top and another in the bobbin and that is visible on the wrong side of fabric
- seam ripper
- thread snips
- rotary cutter, ruler and mat
- extension cord
- · straight pins
- finger pressing tool
- batting or flannel to use as a design wall (optional).

Gyleen's thoughts: I used my collection of Reds and a white Damask tablecloth to make the workshop sample. Yes, a table cloth! All fiber living in my house is fair game for quiltmaking. No matter what you chose it will be stunning. Some ideas include using fabric to form a color wheel or a

fabric collection. If you use a collection, consider adding in a few FQ from your stash for added spark.

Workshop #204

Heather Kojan Carnival

ALL

A bold pieced background sets the tone for this modern take on a Dresden quilt. We'll construct strip sets and do some fussy cutting to make unique combinations of fabrics for our circles. 2 types of applique will be used to bring the quilt together.

Kit fee: \$20 includes pattern, Dresden ruler and 2 types of interfacing. **Supplies:**

- 1 yard each of 5 different solids for background and circles (5 yards total)
- 1-yard print fabric for circles (small stripe, chevron or small-scale print)

- 4 yards backing fabric
- ½ yard binding fabric
- Batting at least 60" x 70" (not required in class)
- Monofilament thread (optional not required in class)

Bonus Size: (62 ½" x 75") If you'd like to make Carnival in a larger size, make the following changes:

- 1 ½ yards each of 5 solid fabrics
- 1 ½ yards print fabric
- ½ yard additional fabric for circles (white in sample)
- ¾ yard binding fabric
- 5 yards backing fabric
- Batting at least 75" x 85"

Workshop #205

Patty Murphy - Yes Ma'am

ALL

In this class you will learn how to make strip-pieced improv fabric without a foundation, how to cut and piece your improv fabric into Half-Square Triangles and arrange the pieces to make your quilt. You

will learn how to accurately piece the Half-Square Triangles into squares, how to accurately measure borders, and how to insert a block into the border. The sample quilt was made entirely from batik scraps (except the borders). Please use any scraps you'd like for your quilt. This is a great quilt to use oddly shaped scraps, leftover strips, and strips you cut from yardage. Consider the colors you want in your quilt and bring a good selection of scraps. I recommend bringing more than you think you'll need. It will be easier if you have each color scrap in a separate container - Ziploc bag, clear shoe box, etc. We will discuss color placement, too, so a wider variety of colors will make your improv piecing by color easier. Because each quilt top will be unique, border fabric requirements will differ. If you have some yardage you think you'd like to use for border and/or sashing, please bring it. You will need a minimum of 1 yard for the border and 1/3 yard for sashing, depending on the quilt you make and its finished size.

Supplies:

- 12 1/2" ruler and cutting mat
- Sewing machine and all its parts
- Basic sewing supplies
- Thread (neutral color for piecing)

Fabric requirements:

4-5 yards of scraps, your choice of colors

Workshop #206

Suzi Parron – Barn Quilt Painted Block

ALL

You will begin with a pre-primed board and go through each step—drafting, taping, and painting, with careful attention to detail. I have plenty of patterns already drafted for you! The workshop lasts about 4-5 hours, including cleanup. You will leave with a finished quilt block, ready to hang. The finished product will be two-by-two feet and is the perfect size for mounting on smaller buildings. Note that we will be painting. It is not really messy, but there is some chance you will get paint on your clothing. Dress accordingly or bring an apron!

Supplies provided for Kit Fee of \$35 include:

- ~Pre-primed 2 by 2-foot board. The priming is a two-day job, which is already done for you
- ~Suggested patterns ready to transfer (you may bring your own, but keep it simple— and be ready to draw it onto the board)
- ~Exterior latex paint
- ~Foam brushes
- ~ Knives for cutting tape

Supplies to Bring:

■ Painter's tape--Green "Frog" brand is BY FAR the best, but blue Scotch tape will do. Narrower tape (about 1 inch) is preferred

- Yardstick or 24-inch ruler
- Pencil
- Blow dryer for every 3-4 people (extension cord could be helpful)

The Zentangle Method is an easy-to-learn, relaxing and fun way to create beautiful images by drawing structured patterns. It is an empowering and uplifting experience. This creative process develops confidence and accomplishment, self-esteem, stress-reduction and well-being. Marisela is a Certified Zentangle Teacher (CZT) and in this workshop she will teach you how to translate the Zentangle Method into stitches to create Zentangle Art Quilts. (Some Free Motion Quilting experience is desirable but not required).

\$15 Supply Fee payable to the instructor includes: original Zentangle tools (paper tiles and pens), pattern for the quilt we are going to make, and an extra set of pens I use for the art quilt.

SUPPLY LIST:

Sewing machine with:

- Free Motion Quilting Foot
- Walking Foot
- Quilting or Microtex Needles size 90/14
- Bobbins with 50 weight cotton thread. Black and White colors.
- 40 weight or thicker, polyester or rayon thread for the top. Black and White colors.

You must know how to operate your own sewing machine. (Some Free Motion Quilting experience is desirable but not required).

- 17"x15" White Solid Fabric (make sure it is not the white on white print kind) washed and ironed, with one layer of Ultra-Light Weight Fusible Interfacing ironed on the back (Pellon 44PKG8 or similar except French Fuse).
- HB pencil, eraser, paper scissors and school ruler
- Your sketchbook
- Freezer Paper
- Your quilting gloves
- Batting and fabric for the back of the quilt. I recommend a busy black print fabric for the back.
- Black and white polka dots fabric for the binding.



Power Curves Preparation Instructions for Practice sandwiches:

Wash, starch and press all fabric. Make 12 practice quilt sandwiches to practice stitching designs. Baste with basting spray or use fusible batting. I like June Tailor's basting spray because a little is enough and it will not gum the needle. I like Quilters Dream fusible cotton and poly batting.

- Cotton fabric Cut twelve 8.5 inch x 8.5 inch pieces of solid, medium to dark fabric
- Batting of choice Cut twelve 10.5 inch x 10.5 inches pieces of batting
- Muslin for backing Cut twelve 10.5 inch x 10.5 inches pieces
- Mark –With a thin permanent marker, (an ink pen will work) mark each 8.5 x 8.5 fabric with a 6-inch square that has a ¼ inch border. NOTE: for best results mark fabric before making the quilt sandwich.



Large Quilt Sandwiches:

 Optional Preprinted Quilt Panels (2/\$20) and bring cotton batting and backing to make two 14" x 14" quilt sandwiches

OR

 Bring two 14" squares of your own cotton fabric, batting and backing to make two 14" x 14" quilt sandwiches

Located approximately 25 miles southeast of Roanoke VA, it is easily accessible from all parts of Virginia.

From Roanoke

From I-81 take exit 143, I-581 S (220 S), through Roanoke and Boones Mill. Continue past Boones Mill on 220 S for 4.2 miles to Wirtz Rd. (Rt. 697). (There will be an Exxon & Dairy Queen on the left, Plateau Park & Franklin Motel on the right.) Turn LEFT onto Wirtz Rd. (Rt. 697). Follow Wirtz Rd. for 5 miles to the stop sign. At stop sign, turn LEFT onto Rt. 122 N (Booker T. Washington Highway). Go 1 mile to Burnt Chimney Rd. Turn RIGHT onto Burnt Chimney Rd. (Rt. 670). Follow Burnt Chimney Rd. for 6.7 miles to Rt. 668. (Dudley's Schoolhouse Store will be on the right directly past the road.) Turn RIGHT onto Rt. 668 (Lovely Valley Rd.). Follow for 0.7 miles to the stop sign. Turn RIGHT onto Rt. 944 (Crafts Ford Rd.). Follow for 1.6 miles to a sharp curve. Turn left onto Hermitage Rd. (Rt. 669). Follow Hermitage Rd. to the 4-H Center.

From Lynchburg / Bedford

From Rt. 460, take second Bedford exit for Rt. 122 S (There will be signs for Smith Mountain Lake.) At traffic light, take a left or right (depends on your direction) onto 122 S. Go 19.8 miles to a traffic light at the intersection of Rt. 122 and Rt. 616 (Optical Office on right). Turn LEFT onto Scruggs Rd. (Rt. 616). Go 0.8 miles and take a RIGHT (shortly past Dairy Queen) onto Brooks Mill Rd. (Rt. 834). (The green street sign will be on the left side of the road.). Go 2.8 miles until you come to a stop sign. (Dick's Food Center will be directly in front of you.). Take a LEFT onto Burnt Chimney Rd. Go 2.5 miles to Rt. 668. (Dudley's Schoolhouse Store will be on the right directly past the road.) Turn RIGHT onto Rt. 668 (Lovely Valley Rd). Follow for 0.7 miles to the stop sign. Turn RIGHT onto Rt. 944 (Crafts Ford Rd). Follow for 1.6 miles to a sharp curve. Turn left onto Hermitage Rd. (Rt. 669). Follow Hermitage Rd. to the 4-H Center.

From Northern Virginia

Take **EITHER** Interstate 81 South to exit 143 (Interstate 581 South/220 South) to Roanoke and *follow directions* above from Roanoke OR take Route 29 South to Lynchburg and *follow directions above from Lynchburg*.

From Richmond or Tidewater Area

Take **EITHER** Route 460 West and *use directions from Lynchburg* **OR** take Interstate 64 West to Interstate 81 South and take exit 143 and *follow the directions from Roanoke*.

From Martinsville, South & North Carolina

On 220 N, take second Rocky Mount exit to Rt. 40 E/W. At end of ramp take a RIGHT onto Rt. 40 E. Go almost 1 mile to Rt. 122 N (You will pass through 4 stoplights; Rt. 122 N is the fourth light.) Take a LEFT onto Rt. 122 N (Booker T. Washington Hwy.). Follow Rt. 122 N for 6.8 miles to Burnt Chimney Road and *follow directions from Roanoke*.
