
IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- Celebration! Dates: April 16 19, 2026. Check in begins at 2:00 PM April 16th. Depart: 11:00 AM April 19th. Cost: \$450.00 per VCQ member in a shared room and \$550.00 per non-member in a shared room. Private room (limited availability) cost: \$575.00 per VCQ member and \$625.00 for non-member. Retreat fee is all-inclusive with the exception of kit fees, class supplies, and spending \$\$\$ for vendors, raffle and silent auction.
- Day Students: \$355.00 per VCQ member and \$455.00 per non-member. Your VCQ membership must be current and active through 2026 in order to register AND attend at the member rate.
- Registration for VCQ Members opens August 1, 2025, online or by mail. A \$100 non-refundable deposit will reserve your spot. Mailed-in registrations will also be accepted, but will not be opened until August 1, 2025.
- Registration for non-members opens September 1, 2025, online or by mail. Any mailed-in registrations from nonmembers received in August will be held until September 1, 2025.
- Registration closes March 1, 2026 (or at capacity). Final payment due February 1, 2026.
- Specify roommate requests when you register. MAKE SURE THE PERSONS YOU REQUEST ALSO REQUEST YOU ON THEIR REGISTRATION FORM.
- Roommates: There will be a 3-person minimum; 4-person maximum. Be aware that the fourth bed is a trundle bed.
- Limited Handicap facilities are available.

SIGHTSEEING LUNCH CRUISE ON THE VIRGINIA DARE



Virginia Consortium of Quilters is adding an exciting new PRE-event to this year's CELEBRATION! 2026. This event is **optional** to our retreat participants.

Celebration! 2026 participants are welcome to sign up for a two-hour lunch and sightseeing cruise on beautiful Smith Mountain Lake which will happen on Thursday, April 16, 2026 before the start of the retreat. Our private chartered vessel is the *Virginia Dare*. A buffet lunch will be served while the ship's staff gives you a narrated tour of one of Virginia's most beautiful lakes. With more than 500 miles of shoreline, Smith Mountain Lake is best seen from the water!

We have 42 seats available on the *Virginia Dare* so you will need to <u>sign up early</u> (Registration for VCQ members starts August 1, 2025 and September 1, 2025 for non-members). The cost for the lunch cruise is \$65.00 per person and you must pay for your ticket in full at the time of registration for Celebration! 2026. We must have at least 30 people sign up for the trip to book the private cruise. If VCQ does not reach this minimum, money will be refunded. Otherwise, the fee for the cruise is <u>non-refundable</u> but may be transferred to another Celebration! 2026 participant with at least a 24 hour notice to VCQ.

The Virginia Dare will sail even if the weather isn't perfect. The lower deck is covered and comfortable in case of light rain. Layered clothing is recommended for the trip as the breeze

across the lake can be cool this time of year. If the captain decides the weather is too severe to sail, participants will be issued a voucher to take a sightseeing trip on the *Virginia Dare* in the future (it will not include lunch). There will not be a cash refund.

The buffet menu for the trip will include pulled-pork BBQ sliders, chicken salad sliders, sweet-and-sour meatballs, cheese and crackers, potato salad, fresh fruit, cookies, sweet tea and water. There are no accommodations for special diets.

Participants must follow the schedule below. All ticket holders must be onboard by 11:30 a.m. on Thursday, April 16, 2026 and the *Virginia Dare* will sail out of the marina at Noon sharp! The captain will not wait even if you have pre-purchased your ticket.

Schedule:

11:00 -11:30am – Check in with VCQ representatives at marina (3619 Airport Rd., Moneta, VA 24121) to receive your Celebration! 2026 welcome bag, nametag, and room key. Drop off your quilt for *Stars and Stripes Forever* quilt challenge. Then you will proceed to the dock.

11:30am – Board the Virginia Dare for the cruise

12:00pm sharp - Virginia Dare departs marina on Smith Mountain Lake

2:00pm - Virginia Dare returns to marina

NOTE: We recommend that you go <u>directly</u> to the W.E. Skelton 4-H Center as soon as you disembark from the *Virginia Dare*. The driving time between the marina and the 4-H center is between 50 minutes to one hour depending on the route you take. You will NOT be able to check in at the 4-H Center prior to the cruise. Cruise ticket holders will check in with VCQ at the marina. If you wish to stay in a hotel on Wednesday night so you will have time to get to the *Virginia Dare* on Thursday morning, we recommend that you stay in Lynchburg or Bedford if you are coming from the east and in Rocky Mount if you are coming from the north or west. *Make sure you leave in plenty of time to get to the marina by 11:30 a.m.*

CELEBRATION! 2026 – FAQs

What does it cost? What is included?

VCQ Members: \$450.00 (shared room); Non-members: \$550.00 (shared room); VCQ Members (private room, limited availability): \$575.00; Non-members (private room, limited availability): \$625.00; Day Participant VCQ member \$355.00; Day Participant Non-members: \$455.00. To receive the member pricing, your membership must be paid through 2026 at time of registration. Visit the web site at www.VCQ.org to become a member. Cost includes lodging, meals, all workshops (except kit fees & supplies), lectures, and special events.

What is the Vi Graves Celebration Scholarship?

The Vi Graves Celebration Scholarship provides financial support for VCQ members to attend the biennial event. Vi was a VCQ member who loved Celebration and lost her life to cancer. Scholarships can be full or partial depending on need and funds available. Applications are submitted to the VCQ President who along with the Celebration! Chair will determine the number and dollar amount of scholarships granted. This process is confidential. A member can nominate another member by submitting their name to the President or submitting a completed form on their behalf. The deadline for submission of the application for a Celebration! 2026 scholarship is February 1, 2026. Application on page 36.

How do I register?

Online registration will begin August 1st, 2025, at www.vcq.org. Your \$100 <u>non-refundable</u> deposit must accompany your registration via PayPal. *Note: It is not necessary to have a PayPal account in order to pay online.* The deposit reserves your space and will be deducted from the total cost. Choose your first- choice classes; if a class is full, you will be prompted to make another choice. Only VCQ members may register in August; non-members may register beginning in September 1st, 2025. Mailed registrations will be processed according to the date they were postmarked. If you prefer to register by mail, please send deposit payable to VCQ (notation: Celebration! 2026) and registration form on page 37 to: Wendy Collyer, 16188 Glenhollow Ct, Culpeper, VA 22701. Registration closes March 1st, 2026 or earlier if capacity is reached. *Please note: Your VCQ membership must be current and active through 2026 in order to register AND attend at the member discounted rate.* Questions? When is final payment due?

Final payments must be received by February 1st, 2026. Remember to keep your VCQ membership up to date through December, 2026. All payments by check should be made payable to VCQ (notation: Celebration! 2026) and sent to: Wendy Collyer, 16188 Glenhollow Ct, Culpeper, VA 22701. Online payments can be made via PayPal. *Note: It is not necessary to have a PayPal account in order to pay online.* Those registering after February 1st, 2026, must pay in full at time of registration.

What is the cancellation policy?

Cancellation requests must be submitted in writing to: Kelly Zuber, Celebration! 2026 Chairperson, emailed to celebration@vcq.org. While the deposit will not be refunded, refunds of additional payments will be issued only for requests postmarked or emailed <u>before February 1, 2026</u>, due to commitments to the 4-H Center and teachers.

What about lodging?

Housing is dormitory style in rooms accommodating a maximum of 4; each room has a private bath with shower, heat and airconditioning, and ample storage. A limited number of handicapped facilities are available. Please indicate your needs when you register. Refrigerators and ice machines are available in the community kitchens in the dormitories. **There will be a three-person minimum, four-person maximum per room. PLEASE INDICATE YOUR ROOMMATES' NAMES/PREFERENCES WHEN REGISTERING AND THEY NEED TO INCLUDE YOUR NAME ON THEIR REGISTRATION FORM.** (4th bed is a trundle so please keep this in mind when selecting your roommates). You may request adjoining rooms on your registration and your request may be honored, but not guaranteed. A limited number of private rooms are available, however, the price to participants will be higher. Private rooms normally have a private bath, however, in the event we have an abundance of private room requests, those registering later may be assigned to a private room with shared toilet and shower facilities. SML 4-H Center is a nonsmoking facility. Bed linens, pillow, blanket and towels will be provided. If desired, you may bring a bathmat, extra towel, extra pillow, hangers, and quilt for your bed.

What are the meals like? What if I have special medically-necessary dietary needs?

Meals are buffet style in the dining hall beginning with dinner on Thursday thru breakfast on Sunday. <u>Indicate any</u> <u>special dietary restrictions due to medical reasons on your registration form</u>. Every effort will be made to accommodate allergies or medically necessary dietary restrictions, but cannot be guaranteed. Menus are chosen by the event committee from a list of options provided by the 4-H center and will be published prior to event.

What if I am concerned about COVID-19 or other airborne illnesses?

For Celebration! 2026 we will assemble to commemorate the 250th birthday of America and the 50th anniversary of the modern-day quilt revival. Our theme, **"AMERICANA**"

Stars & Stripes Forever", is the inspiration to bring back one of the oldest quilt blocks

since the 1920's – the Dresden Plate quilt Block. Kits will be available to purchase in the months prior to Celebration! The kit will provide 1 focus fabric FQ & minimal instructions to make 2 Dresden Plates. In each kit there will be a list of website links

that have free tutorials on making Dresden Plates. There will be a variety of focus fabrics with stars or stripes (keeping with the theme) in various colors. You will use coordinating/contrasting fabric from your stash in order to have a great mixture of Dresden Plates. Kits will be sold for \$5.00 at the in-person meetings through the last in-



person meeting before Celebration! Completed blocks will be collected at Celebration! 2026. Each block turned in gives the maker an entry into the drawing for a block bundle to create a quilt. Be sure to keep your ticket(s) handy. Questions? Contact Karan Fisher at <u>BlockLotto@vcq.org</u>

Square Dance Night (Friday): Participation Optional

Dick Stohr of Snippy Bro's will be at Celebration! 2026 from Friday 12:00 noon to Saturday 12:00 noon to sharpen any Scissor, any Knife and/or some garden tools for \$6.00 each. Cash, PayPal or credit cards accepted. "Bring them <u>dull</u>, take them home <u>sharp like new</u>. I do not grind, I polish the cutting edge with sandpaper belts, so that I remove as little metal as possible. Please contain the items; in a bag/box, or rolled in a dish towel/newspaper plus include your name and phone number. Any item I cannot sharpen to my high standards will receive a refund." *Sharpened items must be picked up before Mr. Snippy leaves on Saturday 12:00 noon.*

Stitching Together History: 250 Quilts Commemorating the Commonwealth of Virginia. Several of the quilts created by VCQ members will be displayed in the hallway outside of the activity center meeting room.

Throughout 2024, quilters from across the United States of America worked to create pieces for this project. Over 275 quilts were submitted to the call for

entries. The quilts were evaluated and narrowed down to 257. These quilts are all 20" by 20" and depict a person, place, event, or idea from Virginia's history. Some are serious. Some are silly. Some are abstract. Some represent a well-known person or place, others show more niche subjects from the past. All come together to create a unique and powerful project commemorating the history of our Commonwealth. The Virginia Quilt Museum is proud to tell this story through an exhibition on display from July 4 through December 22, 2026, and a book to be published by <u>Schiffer Publishing</u>. www.VAquiltmuseum.org

Stars and Stripes Forever Quilt Challenge:

Okay, Folks, Who doesn't love a good contest to compete for winning fame, ribbons, and recognition? The Celebration 2026 Team challenges you to interpret this year's theme, "Americana – Stars and Stripes Forever."

In 1976, the bicentennial helped to revive the art of quilting. Hopefully we will see

interest grow celebrating the 250th year anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence. Think beyond Red, White, and Blue. Think Purple Mountains **Striped** Majesty or **Stars** in My Eyes Over the Mississippi! Use your quilter's creative juices to create what Celebration! 2026's theme comes to mind for you!

Quilt Challenge Guidelines:

- Your quilt must have stars or stripes or both. The stars or stripes or both can be in the pattern, in the fabric, or both and can be any color. It can be all stars or all stripes or a combination.
- Quilts may be any size. Please use the Quilt Entry form and submit by April 2, 2026 for quilts up to 70" X 70". Please submit Quilt Entry form by March 1, 2026 if your quilt will be over 70" X 70".
- Quilt entry forms can be found at https://vcq.org/index.php/celebration/ after August 1, 2025.
- Your quilt must be made with a top and bottom layer, and batting in between with stitching holding it together.
- Your quilt may be pieced or appliqued, modern or traditional. Any technique is acceptable. Other than that it is all up to you and your imagination!
- Your quilt must have a label sewn on the back bottom left hand corner with at least your name, the quilt's name, and the date completed. (This will be covered up for anonymity during competition)
- Your quilt must have a sleeve sewn on the back with a 4" wide hanging sleeve to slide it onto the display frame. For heavy quilts and quilts wider than 80" you may consider making a split sleeve if it needs additional frame support.
- Each Celebration participant can enter ONE quilt which must have been completed in 2025 or 2026.

This will be a **"Viewer's Choice"** competition. There will be award ribbons for the **Best in Show** -First, Second and Third place AND **Best Interpretation of Theme** – First, Second and Third place quilts, as determined by the Celebration! 2026 attendees. We are asking each Celebration attendee entering a challenge quilt to complete a **Quilt Entry form** with basic information. This can be found online at <u>https://vcq.org/index.php/celebration/</u>

Deadline for this entry form will be two weeks before Celebration 2026. Turn in your completed quilt at registration on Thursday by 5:00 pm, April 16, 2026, so we will have time to set up the display. Your creation must be registered and numbered so the Celebration attendees will have a chance to vote for their favorite challenge interpretation.

All quilts need to be picked up at 9:00 am on Sunday, the final day of Celebration! 2026.

We will focus on piecing tips. Even the most experienced piecers will be reminded of a long forgotten trick to make your piecing faster and more efficient. From marking sashing to battling the pesky runaway edges of HSTs, attendees will leave with an arsenal of piecing skills and the know-how to create more accurate piecing in their quilts.



Saturday Evening Mini-Lecture Program presented by Christina Bradley, Group Leader, Roanoke QOV Stitchers.

The Quilts of Valor Foundation is a national organization with groups in all 50 states. The mission of the QOVF is to cover service members and veterans touched by war with comforting and healing Quilts of Valor. A Quilt of Valor is an individual civilian award for a person's service and sacrifice for our country. This award has been vetted with the Defense Department. Workshop #103

Trash to Treasure Pineapples – Gyleen Fitzgerald



Okay, isn't it time to clear the clutter in your life? What about using up all those bits and pieces stuff in nooks, crannies and boxes? Better? Let's make an old fashion favorite pineapple quilt with a new and contemporary twist; sewn with perfection and totally random; and without paper piecing! This workshop turns trash to a treasured one of a kind pineapple quilt.

Fabric Requirements:

1 ½" strips cut from scraps

- 1 ¼ yard of solid or semi-solid fabric, cut 3-4 strips 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " by width of fabric
- 1 ¼ yard or more fabric that you believe is stunning for the border and center squares.

Homework prior to Celebration! 2026:

Cut down all the scraps that you gathered to $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " strips. Grain or length doesn't matter just make sure you have a large variety. The shortest piece needed is 2" and the longest is 6". You're going to need lots of strips. Do not precut to length. Cut (4) or so $1\frac{1}{2}$ " strips of your solid or semi-solid. Bring the rest to class.

Special Tools:

Gyleen's Pineapple Tool (\$17) Instructions: Book – Trash to Treasure Pineapples 2 (\$23)

General Supplies:

- Sewing machine with manual
- ¼"foot without edge guide (if possible)
- (2) thread colors, one for the top and another in the bobbin and that is visible on the wrong side of fabric
- seam ripper
- huge bag or basket that stays open for your strips

- thread snips
- rotary cutter, ruler and mat
- straight pins
- finger pressing tool
- extension cord
- batting to use as a design wall (optional)

Workshop #104

Playful Portraiture: Making Faces in Fabric- Lyric Kinard



Ever wish you could turn a favorite photo into a quilt—but have no idea where to begin? In this fun, fearfree workshop, you'll learn how to create quilted portraits using a simple, step-by-step method that makes faces approachable and fun.

We'll start with giggle-worthy selfie postcards to warm up, then move on to a practice photo provided by Lyric. You'll learn how to trace key shapes, create a pattern, and bring it to life with fusible appliqué—no drawing skills required. The goal isn't perfection—it's play, discovery, and building skills. By the end of class, you'll be ready and excited to go home and turn *your* favorite photo into a quilted portrait all your own.

Supply list:

In a 6 hour class you can practice with the photos and patterns provided, or use your own photo.

For making silly postcards:

- 5" x 7" postcard base: peltex, stabilizer, muslin, paper (virtual only, Lyric will supply this for in-person classes)
- Pile of fabric or colored paper scraps (to be shared during in-person classes)
- Glue stick, damp cloth to wipe off hands
- Very sharp, pointy, scissors
- Optional tweezers for handling small pieces of fabric
- Optional mirror if you want to make a self-portrait in class

For learning how to create a pattern by tracing:

- Pencil
- Black Sharpie (regular sized not fine point, fresh is best)
- Tracing paper, several sheets
- Lyric will provide practice photos for learning the techniques
- If you are feeling brave bring your own black and white photo, enlarged so the face fills up an 11 x 17 paper (see the link below for advanced preparation)
- Light table or LED Light Box Tracer

For creating a fat-quarter sized fusible appliqué portrait :

- Lyric will provide a practice pattern (11 x 17)
- Reynolds Baking Parchment for building your fused portrait dollar store parchment has been found NOT to work (get together and share a roll)
- More parchment or Silicone press sheet to protect irons and surfaces
- Regular tip Black sharpie
- Opaque silver sharpie
- Light tablet (same as above)
- White pencil for dark fabrics
- 1/2 yard Fusible Web (Regular weight Wonder-Under, Misty-Fuse, Steam-a-Seam light *not* Heat 'n Bond)
- Scraps of solid white and black fabric
- Optional: Mini Iron and pressing surface
- Sharp pointy scissors
- 1 Fat-Quarter of solid or tone-on-tone fabric for "skin", can be any color!
- 1/8 yard a little darker than your "skin" fabric, plus one more fabric -1/8 yard even darker
- 2-3 Fat-Eights tone-on-tone prints to share with the class
- Zip-loc bag fully filled with fabric scraps to share with class include as many solids or tone-on-tone prints as you can (same as above, include larger pieces) wild prints are fantastic for hair

*You will choose your background fabric at home after class

Workshop #105

Blue Ridge Quilt or Cane Creek Quilt- Lee Chappell Monroe



Let the geese fly! This class will focus on perfecting your flying geese units with different techniques being shown including four-at-a-time geese. We will talk about fabric and color options and how to use value to create contrast. You will learn lots of tips to create accurate geese with multiple techniques and trimming tools. Using the May Chappell Blue Ridge or Cane Creek patterns, you will also learn about attaching flying geese to one another and keeping the points aligned. The Blue Ridge pattern is a nod to the beautiful Blue Ridge Mountains. The Cane Creek Quilt is inspired by the mountains of Jackson County, peaks surround the valley to create a dynamic look.

Modern Free-Wheeling Circles – Gyleen Fitzgerald



Modern and bold stitched with speed and ease with an extra curve or two. Is that possible? This is my 2017 Iron Quilter Challenge design. Learn the raw edge technique to achieve perfect "stress-free" curves without piecing. Experiment with different layouts to produce a unique design. Game on!

Gyleen's thoughts: Using fluid curves is the game changer. Go large scale solids, semi-solids, and hand-dyed works best. There are lots of collections to choose from. Another option is go on the edge and use a small scale to mid-scale prints from your stash. Bring extra fabric for "oops". This design can

easily be made larger by making more blocks. There are quite a few design options so don't be surprised if you make more than one!

French Boutis Quilting and English Paper Piecing – Audra Rasnake

Holiday Ornament or Pincushion Boutis (French Quilting)

Boutis is a French style of quilting done mostly as "white on white" or "wholecloth". The design is traced onto batiste fabric and stitched without a batting between the fabrics. Yarn is then pulled through areas that students wish to stuff. Very much like trapunto but it is a slightly different technique. Students will learn about the supplies needed, how to transfer a pattern to the fabric, and how to stuff the pattern all while making a holiday ornament or a pincushion. From I-81 take exit 143, I-581 S (220 S), through Roanoke and Boones Mill. Continue past Boones Mill on 220 S for 4.2 miles to Wirtz Rd. (Rt. 697). (There will be an Exxon & Dairy Queen on the left, Plateau Park & Franklin Motel on the right.) Turn LEFT onto Wirtz Rd. (Rt. 697). Follow Wirtz Rd. for 5 miles to the stop sign. At stop sign, turn LEFT onto Rt. 122 N (Booker T. Washington Highway). Go 1 mile to Burnt Chimney Rd. Turn RIGHT onto Burnt Chimney Rd. (Rt. 670). Follow Burnt Chimney Rd. for 6.7 miles to Rt. 668. (Dudley's Schoolhouse Store will be on the right directly past the road.) Turn RIGHT onto Rt. 668 (Lovely Valley Rd.). Follow for 0.7 miles to the stop sign. Turn RIGHT onto Rt. 944 (Crafts Ford Rd.). Follow for 1.6 miles to a sharp curve. Turn left onto Hermitage Rd. (Rt. 669). Follow Hermitage Rd. to the 4-H Center.

From Lynchburg / Bedford

From Rt. 460, take second Bedford exit for Rte 122 S (There will be signs for Smith Mountain Lake.) At traffic light, take a LEFT onto Rt. 122 S/Burks Hill Rd. Go 20.2 miles to a traffic light at the intersection of Rt. 122 and Rt. 616/Scruggs Rd. Turn LEFT onto Scruggs Rd. (Rt. 616). Go 1.8 miles and take a RIGHT on Guilford Rd. 
