Saturday, September 6, 2025

<u>FULL DAY ZOOM – 6-hour Program (10AM-NOON - 1PM-5PM)</u>

Class Description:

In this class you will learn to use the *Creative Grids® Cat's Cradle tool CGRDH1* (not CGRDH1XL), use up some scraps, and learn tips and tricks for adding folded corners. Deb will also talk about how she cut large setting triangles, and how to make them "fancy" like the ones used in this quilt. At the end of class, she'll also give you a few tips for making scrappy binding if you wish to do so for this quilt.



This pattern is a great scrap buster. She literally used scraps from 4 different quilts just sitting in her scrap bin. The quilt contains 2 blocks that seem to intertwine giving this quilt great visual interest no matter what type fabric you use.

Pull out your scrap bag and let's make something awesome together!

- All registered participants will receive the "Scrap-tastic" class description and supply
 list with their paid registration. The <u>Required Ruler: Creative Grids® Cat's Cradle Tool –</u>
 <u>CGRDH1</u> (not CGRDH1XL); optional is the Creative Grids Folded Corner Clipper.
- The required ruler will be available at a VCQ discounted rate of \$20 by Deb plus \$5 shipping at the time of online registration. Otherwise, registrants are encouraged to support their local Creative Grids quilt shops (retail \$23.99)
- The "Scrap-tastic" Pattern will be sent to all paid registrants by 10PM on Friday, September 5th. Participants are encouraged to read through the pattern but <u>do not</u> begin using the Creative Grids® Cat's Cradle Tool CGRDH1 until Deb has introduced how to properly use the tool.




Creative Grids® Designer Deb Heatherly

Deb Heatherly is a former freelance writer and designer for Quilt magazine and has been quilting for 42 years. Her first introduction to sewing was at age 3 when her mother, an accomplished seamstress, and former fabric shop owner, stacked Sears Roebuck catalogs under the machine's foot pedal so that she could reach it. Deb soon



learned to make doll clothes and eventually her own clothes, proudly wearing one of her creations on her first day of high school.



Upon moving to Franklin, Deb opened a quilt shop named "Deb's Cats N Quilts." The shop got its name from an article that she wrote for QUILT magazine entitled "All I know about



quilting I learned from my cats." The article had such a huge response that it was inevitable that in her shop she would play upon that theme. Samples and vignettes throughout shop left no doubt that she is truly a lover of both cats and quilts.

The shop was honored to be featured in SAMPLER magazine in 2016 and although she loved being a shop owner, Deb sold the shop soon after that article so that she could design for Creative Grids® full time. The shop was renamed when it was sold and Deb still publishes under the name Deb's Cats N Quilts. She also has a website by this name www.debscatsnguilts.com

To date she has designed 8 specialty tools for Creative Grids®, The Cat's Cradle and Cats Cradle XL, The Strippy Stars Tool, Turbo 4-Patch, The Ultimate Flying Geese Tool, The Kitty Cornered Tool, The Half Rectangle Trim Tool, and The Hunter's Stars Trim Tool. She is also the author of 8 books and hundreds of patterns that use these tools. Her greatest joy comes from developing techniques and tools that help even a beginner have success. Although she loves all fabric, her love of reproduction fabrics and primitives is reflected in many of her designs.

Deb is the creator of an online Facebook group called 'Grids Girls' which has over 15,000 members from all over the world. She designs two special mystery quilts for the group each year that are highly anticipated by the group members.

Deb is married to her husband Phil and they currently have 5 spoiled kitties: Max, Monroe (shown at right), Timmy, Little, and Loo Loo. She has one daughter and one grandson. She also has a sister who has discovered quilting in just the past year. Her family members each claim to be her biggest fan.

Deb is now limiting her traveling schedule, (to spend more time with her husband and the furry kids), but still hosts 2 annual retreats, writes for Country Register, and teaches zoom classes almost monthly.

MINUTES OF THE LAST GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING

VCQ General Membership Meeting in Staunton, VA Saturday June 14, 2025

President: Kathy Gray, called the meeting to order at 12:40pm. She welcomed everyone. She thanked the Virginia Quilt Museum for the reception on Friday night and asked how many members attended. She stated that it is good for us to have a friendly, working relationship with the museum. She then announced that we would begin with the introductions of the Board and their reports.

Vice President: Karilyn Pittman called Karen Brewster to the stage. Karilyn presented Karen with a quilt for her service as President. Karilyn explained that the blocks were made by various members and collected. Then Karilyn pieced it together and Beverly Burroughs quilted it. Karen thanked everyone and loves it. Karilyn then talked about Memorial quilt and that two names have been added: Dianne Reasons and Virginia Ruffner. Karilyn let everyone know that she was informed that Diana Michaud had passed away in October 2024 so she will be adding that leaf on as well if it has not been done already. Karilyn then announced that we had 20 members that were attending their first in-person meeting: Lois Born, Sue Erickson, Arlene Goldberg, Alicia Gutschow, Betty Heck, Beverly Hutchinson, Oma McReynolds, Carol Pape, Janis Scorpio, Linda Seiberling, Melinda Smith, Denise Southwick, Kathy Stowe, Louise Sutara, Robin Tennefoss, Trudi Van Dyke, Felicia Ward, Marnie Wheatley, Karen Whitley, Brenda Woods. They were all given a VCQ 40th Anniversary zipper pull.

*Treasurer: Constance Horne announced that as of 5/31/2025 we have \$ for Gross Profit, \$ for Expenses, \$ is in Money Market, and \$ in checking. She explained that we move money from Money Market to checking as needed so that the Money Market account continues to make a profit.

Secretary: President Gray announced that the minutes of the March 2025 general meeting were published in the newsletter and corrected by the Board. She asked for any other corrections. None were stated so the minutes will stand as published.

Historian: Kitty Bull explained the importance of labeling your quilts. She brought two quilts to display at the Lotto Block table and neither of them have a label so no one can tell how old they are, where they were made or who made them. Quilts don't always stay in the family and people can forget about the details after time. When you label a quilt put why it was given, to who, by who and the month and date. She also suggested that you put your maiden name as well so if someone is researching the history 100 years from now, that family will also show up. Kitty also let everyone know she is working on archiving VCQ history onto drives.

Membership: Faye Hannah announced that we have 281 members. Of those, 59 are new members who joined in 2025. Faye announced that members can now renew online and new members are able to join online. The link is on the VCQ website and you can join or renew for 1-5 years.

Virtual Programs: Kathy Hippeli reported that we are doing a Virtual class on September 6th with Deb Heatherly who is a Creative Grids Designer. The class is called "Scrap-tastic" and will be from 10am-5pm. The cost is \$65 from members, \$75 for non-members. Kathy has the ruler for sale that is needed with her today or you can purchase for \$25 when you register. The

pattern is included in the cost of the class. A supply list will be emailed after registration and the pattern will be emailed on September 5th – the day before the class. Kathy is also working on another New Year's Eve day.

In-Person Programs: Jan Farrow announced that we will meet in Culpeper on October 25th. The address of the venue is on the calendar so members can begin to shop around for hotels. The March 2026 meeting is still being worked on.

Newsletter: Mary Grogan announced that the deadline for the newsletter is August 15th but please send in as soon as you are able. Try to get in by August 10th so there is time to get everything arranged. Last minute sends are a lot of work because things have to be moved around to accommodate the new information. Depending on how big the article is it can take a couple hours to rearrange everything.

Technology: Tammy Halstead announced Mary Grogan, Constance Horne and Kathleen Hippeli helped to removed information off the old website to the new website. Any members that would like to volunteer to finished getting the new website updated, please let Tammy know. Tammy announced that they have found that some people are having a problem when doing registration online. When they process their payment, they are kicked out. Tammy asked to please NOT re-register but to email her. She can see if the payment actually went through and if not she can send a Paypal link to pay. The online registration for the September 6th virtual class will go live on Monday June 16th. Members were also reminded to not text or email the password for the Members only section of the website. If you don't remember what it is please call Tammy or Faye.

Publicity: Kelly Zuber let Area Reps know that she has rack cards with her for those who need them.

Celebration 2026: Kelly Zuber explained, for members who are not aware, that Celebration is a 4-day, all inclusive retreat with workshops at Smith Mountain Lake. The first one was held in 1988. Celebration will be held from Thursday, April 16th thru Sunday, 19th 2025 and is centered around 250 year Anniversary of our country. Kelly suggested members encourage their quilting friends who may not be members to go with you. It's a great way to see what VCQ is all about. Kelly announced that Block Lotto kits are for sale and are \$5. On July 4th the brochure will be published online. On August 1st member sign-up will open. On September 1st, non-member sign-ups will be opened. On February 1st the balance will be due. Kelly then announced some things to think about, especially if you have never been to Celebration: Roommates: think of who you want to room with as you need to put that on your registration form; Spring Clean your quilt room: bring donations for the silent auction; Challenge quilt: plan your quilt and bring completed quilt to Celebration; 2 ½" strips and 10" squares: if you participate in this you bring them, turn them in and receive a ticket. Winners of the strips and squares will be called; Collect things to be sharpened: Mr. Snippy will be there to sharpen scissors and knives; Lake Cruise: if you are taking the lake cruise, begin looking for lodging for Wednesday night; Wearables: bring to the show to model (or have a friend model for you!).

Community Service: Karin McElvein reminded everyone to please label the quilts and fill out the paperwork to turn into her with the quilt. The size for ALS quilts is a minimum of 45" x 60". She will be making one more trip to turn in quilts and will have a final number at the next meeting.

Block of the Month: Karen Brewster announced the next Block of the Month, Blocks 5 & 6, is coming out tomorrow. Karen and Kathy Gray showed the 6 blocks they have made so far. They announced that CT publishing would not give permission to use their instructions so Karen is now using Quilter's Cache which has many free patterns on it. For anyone who has not signed up there is still time. The Block patterns are in the Members area of the website. Both Karen and Kathy told members to have fun and be creative with the blocks.

Area Reps: President Kathy Gray announced that we are looking for two more area reps to cover the Charlotteville/Lynchburg area and the Shenandoah Valley. If anyone is interested, please see her.

New/Old Business: President Kathy Gray announced that every October we vote on half of the Board as laid out by our founding mothers. Last October we voted for our new President and continuing Historian. We should have also voted for Secretary but we did not have a nominee. Lisa Frieman graciously continued until now when she has found her replacement, Karan Fisher. In accordance with our by-laws, Karan needs to be elected. She then asked for a motion. Faye Hannah made the motion for Karan Fisher to be Secretary. Karin McElvein seconded the motion. The motion passed and Karan Fisher is the new Secretary.

President Kathy Gray then asked for the Nomination Committee representative to announce the slate for our election in October. Debi Harding announced: Vice President-Karilyn Pittman, Treasurer – Constance Horne, and Membership Chairman – Lisa Frieman. If anyone else has any nominations for these positions, please contact Debi Harding or Kathy Gray.

President Kathy Gray then reminded everyone that if you like being together at our inperson meetings, the next best thing is to see each other at our Zoom Come Quilt With Me sessions. There are six sessions per month: first Tuesdays at 1:00 with Phyllis Keesee, , third Saturday at 9:00 with various members of the board and every Sunday at 2:00 with Deb Schupp. Next Saturday's session is being led by Lisa Frieman. If these times are not convenient, talk to Tammy, Mary Grogan or me about starting a new bee. We pay the same for Zoom no matter how much we use it so let's use it.

President Gray then dismissed everyone at 1:52pm to go back to their classes and to return at 3:45pm. The members all returned at 3:45 and reconvened for Show and Tell and Door Prizes. President Kathy Gray called Jan Farrow to the stage. Jan introduced each teacher and the projects were shown by the members of the class. President Kathy Gray then asked anyone who had brought an ALS quilt to show their quilts. We always turn them in and forget to show them. There was a wonderful amount of quilts. President Gray then asked for any general show and tell to be brought up. After Show and Tell, Karilyn Pittman gave out door prizes: Layer Cake-Sue Erickson; Fat Quarter Bundle-Janice Willis; Fat Quarter Bundle-Wendy Collyer; Jelly Roll-Becky Hall and a Hand Dyed Fat Quarter-Shelly Norris.

President Gray thanked everyone for coming and wished them safe travels. The meeting ended at 4:13pm.

Thank you to all the members making quilts for the Hopes and Dreams Quilt Challenge for ALS. Quilters Dream Batting has held an annual competition to continue the fight to find a cure. They provide an entry form in each package of

batting purchased. VCQ has the form on our website to print, complete and pin to each quilt. Just make sure you circle the entry category of "Quilt Guild". The new minimum completed size, requested by ALS, is 45" x 60" or larger lap and bed size welcome. Your name and address is used to receive a personal handwritten note of thanks from Quilters Dream Batting.

For the Hopes and Dreams ALS Charity, I delivered 19 quilts in July. Their calendar year goes from August 1st to July 31st. Therefore, we donated 55 quilts to them for this year's contest. I want to thank everyone on donated their time to cutting fabric, sewing quilt tops and then quilting them. I want to remind everyone to always put a simple label on their quilt. I would also like to suggest to those who piece tops and then give them to someone else to quilt to fill out a Hopes and Dreams form and submit it with your quilt. The person who then quilts the quilt will know who to give credit to on the label. The quilter should also include her name. In other words, the label should include the name of person who pieced the quilt and also the name of the person who quilted it.


VCQ In-Person Meeting Information

Bargello in the Round - Machine Class

In this class we will be making a spiral bargello using strip sets and cutting with the 10-degree wedge ruler. Finished project measures 42" in diameter.



Skill Level Required: The pattern calls for intermediate skill level. If you are a confident beginner, I think we can make it work!

Kit Fee: none /optional Printed and Marked template \$1 (advance orders only – see information below)

Supply List: Your Basic Sewing Supplies. ie: machine, pins, scissors, etc. A mat, rotary cutter, 24-inch ruler, 10-degree wedge ruler/template.

Four 28" \times 44" fabrics. Be sure to include a light, a dark and 2 in between fabrics for best contrast. One additional 10" \times 10" piece of one of the fabrics for the center

Pre-cut each fabric into 8—2 ¾ inch wide strips

I am blessed with a small studio in Culpeper where I can unleash my passion using vibrant colorful fabrics and teaching new people how to sew and quilt. I am the current president of Culpeper Quilters Guild and have greatly enjoyed making new friends within the quilt community. I have recently released my first self-produced quilt pattern.

Hawaiian Needle-Turn Applique – Hand Class

In this Full-Day workshop students will work on a pattern inspired by Cheryl's quilt, Hawaiian Improv which won Best of Show at the 2017 Mid-Atlantic Quilt Festival. Students will learn a different technique than the traditional fold and cut method for a more detailed Hawaiian style quilt. Needle-Turn applique is used to start an innovative Hawaiian style pattern, Small Town, from A Walk in the Park Pattern series. Hand embroidery stitches will be taught and used to embellish the project.

Skill Level Required: Beginner to Advanced

Kit Fee: \$20 includes

- Small Town pattern
- Extra copy of Small Town template for cutting
- Spool of Sew Sassy thread
- Roxanne Glue-Baste-It Dip & Dab

Supplies:

- 1 yard of background fabric
- 1 yard of applique fabric (preferable high count like a batik)
- Applique needle
- Appliqué pins
- Thimble- optional
- Long ruler suitable to draw lines with
- Clear tape and/or masking/painters tape
- Permanent black marker
- Small, sharp embroidery scissors
- Paper scissors ideally with sharp point
- Thread to match applique
- Thread for basting- I use serger thread or old thread
- Pen for taking notes
- Marking tool that will show on chosen applique fabric and background fabric





- Light box- optional
- Variety of embroidery floss
- Embroidery needle
- Embroidery hoop
- Clover clip- optional
- Scrap of solid fabric to practice embroidery stitches on; preferably white
- Portable light optional

Prep for Workshop:

Fold the applique fabric in half (from top to bottom) and press gently on the fold. Fold in half again (from left to right) and

press gently on the fold. Unfold fabric and lay flat. Baste with thread on the pressed folds either by machine or by hand through one layer of fabric OR mark with removable marking pencil that is clearly visible on your fabric.



 Note that the applique fabric only is marked and that the applique fabric and backing fabric are NOT basted together!

Quilt As You Go – Machine Class

If you have ever wondered about how to quilt your own projects but felt unsure about where to start, this class is designed for you. We will explore and create samples using several different techniques, giving you a clear understanding of your available options for quilting as you go, including how to attach quilted blocks to each other!



Skill Level: All - Must have a basic understanding of your machine and quilting tools/terminology.

Kit Fee: \$15 includes batting, backing and fabric for samples (if you have scraps of fabric or 2.5 inch jelly roll scraps you may choose to bring them)

Supply List: Sewing machine in good working condition (with an even feed foot if possible). White thread for bobbin and quilting, and your basic sewing kit of rotary cutter (with new blade) and small cutting mat, scissors, pins and a ruler for squaring up your blocks.



Barb Tinder has been a professional longarm quilter since buying her first Gammill in 2005. She taught dressmaking and alterations for Singer Company for ten years as a young mother. Her maternal grandmother, a professional seamstress herself, started teaching her as a young child to sew, draft patterns and make alterations as needed. Barb is now proudly passing these skills on to her own granddaughter and happy to be asked to teach QAYG for VCQ.

Celebration 2026 Quilt Challenge - "Stars And Stripes Forever"

Okay, Folks, **Who** doesn't love a good contest to compete for winning fame, ribbons, and recognition? The Celebration 2026 Team challenges you to interpret this year's theme, **"Americana."**

In 1976, the bicentennial helped to revive the art of quilting. Hopefully we will see interest grow celebrating the 250th year anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence. Think beyond Red, White, and Blue. Think Purple Mountains **Striped** Majesty or **Stars** in My Eyes Over the Mississippi! Use your quilter's creative juices to create what Celebration 2026's theme comes to mind for you!

Additional Guidelines:

- Your quilt must have stars or stripes or both. The stars or stripes or both can be in the pattern, in the fabric, or both and can be any color. It can be all stars or all stripes or a combination.
- Quilts may be any size. Please use the Quilt Entry form and submit by April 10,2026 for quilts up to 70' X 70". Please submit Quilt Entry form by March 1, 2026 if it will be over 70" X 70". Quilt Entry forms can be found online here.
- 3 Your quilt must be made with a top and bottom layer and batting in between with stitching holding it together.
- 4 Your quilt may be pieced or appliqued, modern or traditional. Any technique is acceptable. Other than that it is all up to you and your imagination!
- 5 Your quilt must have a label sewn on the back bottom left hand corner with at least your name, the quilt's name, and the date completed. (this will be covered up for anonymity during competition)
- **6** Your quilt must have a sleeve sewn on the back with a 4" wide hanging sleeve to slide it onto the display frame. For heavy quilts and quilts wider than 80" you may consider making a split sleeve if it needs additional frame support.
- **The Each Celebration participant can enter ONE quilt which must have been completed in 2025** or 2026.

This will be a "Viewer's Choice" competition. There will be award ribbons for the Best in Show - First, Second and Third place AND Best Interpretation of Theme – First, Second and Third place quilts, as determined by the Celebration! 2026 attendees. We are asking each Celebration attendee entering a challenge quilt to complete a pre-entry form with basic information. This can be found online here. Deadline for this entry form will be two weeks before Celebration 2026. Turn in your completed quilt at registration on Thursday by 4:00 pm, April 24, 2026, so we will have time to set up the display. Your creation must be registered and numbered so the Celebration attendees will have a chance to vote for their favorite challenge interpretation.
