# " Recipes From VCQ's Past Years"

Searching through the Historian's archives of Newsletters and Meeting minutes, Kitty found some recipes from past events AND a mention of the VCQ Celebration 2004 Cookbook that was published with recipes from Celebration participants, teachers and Quilt shops.

Recipes from the 1980's newsletters -

#### **Party Chicken**

- ★1 pkg chipped beef or several slices of country ham
- ★ 6 strips of bacon ★ 6 chicken breasts (deboned and skinned)
- ★1 can cream of mushroom soup ★ 1 can cream of chicken soup
- ★8 oz. sour cream

Put ham or chipped beef inside chicken breasts. Place chicken in greased baking dish. Place one strip of bacon around each chicken breast. Combine soups and sour cream. Pour over chicken and bake at 250° for 3 hours. You'll have a nice gravy to serve over rice or potatoes. Country ham was used for the VA Beach VCQ event.

#### **Yummy Yam Bake**

One 15 ¼ oz. can pineapple tidbits \* 2 cans (17 oz.) yams, drained

- ★ ¼ cup plain flour ★ 3 tbsps. Brown sugar ★ ½ tsp. cinnamon ★ 1/8 tsp. salt
- ★3 tbsps. Margarine ★ ¼ cup chopped pecans ★ ¼ cup miniature marshmallows

Drain pineapple (reserving ¼ cup syrup). Arrange yams on bottom of 10"x 6" baking dish. Pour pineapple syrup over yams. Sprinkle pineapple tidbits over yams. Combine flour, brown sugar, salt, cinnamon, and "cutting in" the margarine until course crumbs are formed. Stir in pecans. Sprinkle this mixture over the pineapple tidbits. Bake at 350° for 35 minutes. Top with marshmallows and bake about 5 minutes more or place under broiler until golden brown being careful that marshmallows don't burn.

#### **Apple Crisp**

2 cups sliced Apples ★ ½ cup flour

- ★ ¼ cup margarine
- ★1/4 cup brown sugar ★ 1 tsp. cinnamon

Blend the flour, margarine, brown sugar and cinnamon with a pastry blender to form course crumbs. Place sliced apples into a shallow buttered baking dish,. Cover the apples with the



flour/sugar mixture. Bake at 375° until apples are tender and the crumb mixture is brown, approx. 45 minutes. If using canned apples, bake for only 30 minutes. Serve warm with ice cream or whipped cream. Serves four.

## **2009 Board Retreat**

#### **Crustless Quiche - Mary Grogan**

This recipe is quick and simple to prepare and is extremely adaptable to any season. The flour in the batter gives it a bit of a crust without the work (and calories) of making one. Be Creative! Serves 8

Preheat oven to 350°. **Stir together** –  $\frac{1}{2}$  cup flour  $\star$   $\frac{1}{2}$  tsp salt  $\star$  2 tbsps. fresh herbs or  $\frac{1}{2}$  tsp dried of your choice.

**Thoroughly Mix** - flour mixture into 1 cup evaporated milk or light cream using a wire whisk. **Beat In** five eggs. **Stir In** 1 cup cooked vegetables (chard, asparagus, squash, etc.) ★ 1 cup coarsely grated mild cheese of your choice.

**Pour** into a 9-inch lightly buttered pie plate. **Bake** in center of 350° oven for 35-40 minutes, or until pie is set. (it will rise as it cooks). **Cool** 5-10 minutes before serving.

## Recipes (a few) from the Celebration 2004 Cookbook

#### **Goat Cheese and Phyllo Appetizers** – Selwyn Knap

- ★6 sheets Phyllo (thawed) ★ 8 oz. goat cheese
- ★ 1 tbsp. fresh rosemary (finely minced) ★ 1 tsp lemon juice
- ★ 3-4 tbsps. Margarine (melted) ★1 clove garlic (pressed)

**Filling** – Combine goat cheese, garlic, lemon juice, and rosemary.

Working quickly with phyllo so it doesn't dry out, lay one sheet on a flat dry surface. Brush with the melted margarine and lay a second sheet over top. Brush second layer with margarine and lay a third sheet on top. Do not brush with margarine. Using kitchen shears, cut layers of phyllo into four lengthwise sections. Spoon 1/8<sup>th</sup> of the filling about 1 inch from the end of each layered strip. Beginning at the end of the strip with the filling, fold the layered phyllo strip at a 45° angle over top of the filling. Keep making triangular folds until strip is used up and the filling is completely enclosed. Place triangle (loose ends down) on a baking sheet, lightly coated with cooking spray and brush each triangle with margarine. Repeat process with the other three phyllo sheets and remaining filling. Bake triangles at 375° for about 15 minutes until golden. Makes 8 phyllo triangles. Recipe may be halved.

#### **Cold Broccoli Salad – Susan Fulton**

- ★16 pieces bacon, cooked and crumbled ★ 2 bunches broccoli ★ 3/4 cup raisins
- ★1/2 cup onion, chopped (Vidalia or Spanish) ★ pimentos (optional)
- ★1 cup mayonnaise ★ 1/3 cup sugar ★ 2 Tbsps. Apple cider vinegar

Cut broccoli florets off stalk and chop. Discard stems and leaves. Mix chopped broccoli with bacon, pimentos, raisins, and onion. Make dressing of mayonnaise, sugar and vinegar. Pour over broccoli and mix well. Refrigerate for 2 hours.



# Tomato Soup Spiced Cake Sharon H Dawson

- ★2 cups all purpose flour
- ★1 1/3 cups sugar
- ★4 tsps. Baking powder
- ★1½ tsps.. ground allspice
- ★1 tsp. baking soda
- ★1 tsp ground cinnamon ★1/2 tsp. ground cloves ★ % cup water
- ★1 can Campbell's Tomato Soup ★ ½ cup vegetable shortening ★ 2 eggs

Cream Cheese Frosting: 1 8oz. package cream cheese (softened) ★ 2 tbsps. Milk

★ 1 tsp. vanilla extract ★ 16 oz package Confectioner's Sugar. In bowl, with mixer at medium speed, beat 1 8oz. package of cream cheese, 2 tbsps. Milk and 1 tsp. vanilla extract until creamy. Gradually beat in one 16 oz package of Confectioner's sugar until smooth and spreadable.

**Preheat** oven to 350°. **Grease** and flour 13"x 9" baking pan. **Mix** flour, sugar, baking powder, allspice, baking soda, cinnamon, and cloves. **Add** water, soup, shortening, and eggs. With mixer at low speed, **beat** until well mixed, constantly scraping bowl. At high speed, **beat** 4 minutes, occasionally scraping bowl. Pour into prepared pan and **bake** 40 minutes or until toothpick inserted in center comes out clean. **Cool**, then **frost** with Cream cheese frosting.

## **2010 Board Retreat- Mexican Egg Puff – Susan Price**

- ★10-12 Eggs ★ ½ cup flour ★ 1 tsp. baking powder ★ ½ tsp. salt
- ★1 (16oz.) container cottage cheese ★1/2 cup butter (melted & cooled)
- ★1 lb. shredded Monterey Jack cheese ★2(4oz) cans diced green chiles

Preheat oven to 350°. In medium bowl, beat eggs until light and lemon colored. Add flour, baking powder, salt, cottage cheese, Monterey Jack, and butter. Blend until smooth. Stir in chiles. Pour into buttered 9" x13" baking dish. Bake for 35 minutes.

For those of you who couldn't come to the October 25th, 2025 meeting in Culpeper VA, you missed the chance to view Cheryl See's "Hawaiian Improv" Quilt up close and personal. So much detail went into the hand quilting that you had to view it from a few feet away to see that it was actually a quilt within a quilt as the hand stitching told a story to complement the appliqued buildings and gardens of this beautiful English town.

Thank you to all the members making quilts for the Hopes and Dreams Quilt Challenge for ALS. Quilters Dream Batting has held an annual competition to continue the fight to find a cure. Their contest always runs from August 1st to July 31st. We

came in 2nd this past year as we contributed a little over 50 quilts. The quild that came in 1st contributed over 100. The challenge has begun!!

VCQ has the <u>form on our website</u> to print, complete and pin to each quilt. Just make sure you circle the entry category of "Quilt Guild". The new minimum completed size, requested by ALS, is 45" x 60" or larger lap and bed size welcome. Your name and address is used to receive a personal hand-written note of thanks from Quilters Dream Batting.

I want to remind everyone to always put a simple label on their quilt. I would also like to suggest to those who piece tops and then give them to someone else to quilt to fill out a Hopes and Dreams form and submit it with your quilt. The person who then quilts the quilt will know who to give credit to on the label. The quilter should also include her name. In other words, the label should include the name of person who pieced the quilt and also the name of the person who quilted it.

#### A Reminder About the Vi Graves Celebration Scholarship Fund

What is the Vi Graves Celebration Scholarship? The Vi Graves Celebration Scholarship provides financial support for VCQ members to attend the biennial event. Scholarships can be full or partial depending on need and funds available.

Applications are submitted to the VCQ President who along with the Celebration Chair will determine the number and dollar amount of scholarships granted. This process is confidential. A member can nominate another member by submitting their name to the President or submitting a completed form on their behalf.

The deadline for submission of the application for a Celebration 2026 scholarship is February 1, 2026.



Vi was a member of VCQ from 1985 to 2001. She, along with Marty Moon was the cochair of the Virginia Heritage Quilts project beginning in 1985. She was the Registrar for the first Celebrations in 1988 and 1990. She was an active presence in most of the events that VCQ held in the early days, and continued to participate with VCQ until she lost her life to cancer in 2001.

# **CELEBRATION 2026 Quilt Challenge**

#### STARS AND STRIPES FOREVER GUIDELINES

- 1 Your quilt must have stars or stripes or both. The stars or stripes or both can be in the pattern, in the fabric, or both and can be any color. It can be all stars or all stripes or a combination.
- Quilts may be any size. Please use the Quilt Entry form and submit by April 10,2026 for quilts up to 70' X 70". Please submit Quilt Entry form by March 1, 2026 if it will be over 70" X 70". You can complete the online form here, or use the form on the next page.
- 3 Your quilt must be made with a top and bottom layer and batting in between with stitching holding it together.
- 4 Your quilt may be pieced or appliqued, modern or traditional. Any technique is acceptable. Other than that it is all up to you and your imagination!
- **5** Your quilt must have a label sewn on the back bottom left hand corner with at least your name, the quilt's name, and the date completed. (this will be covered up for anonymity during competition)
- 6 Your quilt must have a sleeve sewn on the back with a 4" wide hanging sleeve to slide it onto the display frame. For heavy quilts and quilts wider than 80" you may consider making a split sleeve if it needs additional frame support.
- **Each** Celebration participant can enter ONE quilt which must have been completed in 2025 or 2026.

This will be a "Viewer's Choice" competition. There will be award ribbons for the Best in Show - First, Second and Third place AND Best Interpretation of Theme – First, Second and Third place quilts, as determined by the Celebration! 2026 attendees. We are asking each Celebration attendee entering a challenge quilt to complete a pre-entry form with basic information. Deadline for this entry form will be two weeks before Celebration 2026. Turn in your completed quilt at registration on Thursday by 4:00 pm, April 24, 2026, so we will have time to set up the display. Your creation must be registered and numbered so the Celebration attendees will have a chance to vote for their favorite challenge interpretation.
