A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

BE AN AREA REP

The VCQ Board is looking for members to be the Area Reps for Lynchburg, Richmond, and the Shenandoah Valley. Area Reps stay connected via email or Zoom and visit their local quilt shops and guilds. The term is usually two years but there is no limit.

Duties include:

- Send emails to members reminding them of upcoming events like Come Quilt with Me, Zoom sew-alongs, registration deadlines for Zoom and in-person workshops, etc. You just create a contact group, then write and send a short note.
- Visit or ask another member to visit local guilds to promote VCQ. VCQ Area Reps are vital to letting people know about VCQ and to building our membership.
- Attend VCQ board meetings every other month on Zoom. (About one hour.)
- Attend VCQ annual board retreat the second Saturday in January.



Although we won't be finishing the entire project in class, you'll have a good start, and the tools you'll need to finish it at home, in half the time you'd expect from paper piecing.

With the popularity of David's virtual programs and limited ZOOM capacity, this will no doubt make this a quick sell-out! Jelly Roll Placemats or Rug – Machine Class

In this class we will be making either 4 Jellyroll placemats or a Jellyroll rug.



4 Placemats or 1 Rug

Skill Level Required: Beginner

Kit Fee: none

Supply List: Sewing machine (dual foot or walking foot preferred) that can sew with an adjustable zig zag stitch, zig zag stitch plate, foot that can do zig zag stitch, sewing table/tray, clover tube maker, coordinating colored thread for assembly of the rug (will be seen), needles (jean needles work best), scissors, glue stick, stiletto, 3 full bobbins (use coordinating thread as it will be seen), clips

1. Optional: water spritz bottle or Best Press spray bottle or Magic Spray bottle, wool mat
 2. 1-Jellyroll of 42 strips – before class you can join strips end to end – on the diagonal (mitered seams), if making rug join all 42 strips, if making placemats join 4 sets of 10 strips (1 jellyroll makes 4 placemats)
 3. Katahdin Batting 2 ¼" x 50 yard – can be purchased at your local quilt shop or Amazon
- **Tube makers – both of these tube makers will work.

Cathedral Stars – Machine Class

This pretty 70x70 quilt is deceptively easy to make. Made with some strip piecing and folded curves giving the stars an almost floral appearance. The free pattern is by Donna Jordan.



Skill Level : Experienced beginner or Intermediate.

Kit Fee: None

Supplies: Notions

Rotary cutter, mat and quilt ruler

Thread in a color that will work with your fabrics.

A sewing machine that will stitch a straight 1/4"

Your preferred 1/4" foot

Some straight pins

Fabric Requirements:

Background – 3 ¾ yards

Medium Print for star points – 1 ¼ yards

Dark accent for 4 center square – 3/8 yard

Sashing – 1 yard

Cornerstones – 1/8 yard

Amanda was born and raised just outside Belfast, Northern Ireland, she is married to Michael and has only children with fur and four feet. She started sewing at the age of five on an old Singer treadle machine and has sewn ever since. In the early years she sewed doll clothes and customized her own clothes with ribbons, lace and sequins.

Eventually this progressed to taking a sewing qualification that included fine tailoring, craft sewing and home décor. Her journey with quilting started in the 1970's when her Mum taught her how to do English Paper Piecing using cardboard, newspaper and fabrics reclaimed at Jumble Sales, or whatever fabrics could be recycled.

Whilst Amanda's professional life led her into a long career in Human Resources and Management Development, Training and Coaching, she continued to sew and work in creative fields, including training professional painters in using decorative paint effects and glazing, paper crafting and scrapbooking. At various times she has done silk painting, silver clay jewelry, mosaics, stained and foiled glass, hand embroidery, cross stitch and knitting. Her sewing journey has led her to make her own formal ballgowns, jackets, drapes, decorative cushions, pillows and of course quilts.

She moved to the USA in 2010 and decided to take the opportunity to focus more on a creative career working first for an industrial embroidery factory (to learn all about machine embroidery and digitizing) and then, for the past eight years, working as an Educator with a local sewing and quilt stores. A year ago she decided to focus on her longarm business (Stitchery Do Dah) and retired from the outside “day job”. Her love of quilting continues to grow, and she is particularly interested in big bold colors and modern quilting.

Kawandi Quilting – Hand Class

Learn the technique for the Kawandi-style of patchwork. This class project is scaled to be finished in one day - perfect to see if you enjoy the process. Choose to make a square or an envelope pouch.



Skill Level: All- Be able to thread a needle and do a running stitch.

Kit Fee: None

Supply List: 10" square of backing fabric*.

9" square of thin batting**.

OR

6"x12" rectangle of backing fabric*

5" x 11" rectangle of thin batting**

Plus

o Scraps of fabric* about 4" to make patches.

o #8 or #12 embroidery thread. Choose a color that will look good with your fabrics but not particularly matching. You want it to show. Variegated threads are fun.

- o Needle that threads easily with your choice of thread.
Needle threader if you need it.
 - o Thimble, highly recommended.
 - o Straight pins (5-10) and binding clips (not necessary but can be helpful).
 - o Scissors. You can use a rotary cutter and mat but not necessary.
- NO sewing machine. No rulers either. This is a low-tech process.

Homework:

Fold over and press 1/2" around the edges of your backing fabric.

*Batiks are not recommended because they are harder to hand stitch (but I do use them).

**Quilters Dream Request is ideal but any thin batting works.

Bring your own hand or machine project or work on ALS Charity Quilt kits as you sit and quilt with other members and experience wonderful fellowship. During CQWM if you haven't made your block lotto Dresden plates for Celebration there will be an opportunity to work on them. Karan Fisher will be available to answer questions and show her video and samples.



BLOCK LOTTERY – Half Square Triangles

At the March In-Person meeting in Williamsburg, VCQ is trying something different for VCQ, but which members do regularly at our local guilds. We will accept 4 ½ inch (unfinished) Half-Square Triangle blocks. For every block turned in you will get a ticket. Tickets will be drawn at the end-of-the-day ceremony at the same time as the door prizes. The winner will go home with a stack of blocks with which you can make hundreds of different designs.

Sew your blocks with your favorite method of making HSTs. Since it will be spring, use shades of pink and/or green with cream. Use any fabrics as long as they are fabric shop quality – batiks, prints or solids, just ensure there is a high contrast between the two halves. Bring them to Williamsburg, find the table to turn them in near registration or at lunch and take your tickets. Good luck!

VCQ General Membership Meeting in Culpeper, VA

Saturday October 24, 2025

Minutes

President: Kathy Gray called the meeting to order at 12:49pm. She welcomed everyone and thanked Deb Schupp, Jan Farrow and Phyllis Keesee for finding the facility to host the meeting. President Gray spoke of the “Button Game” where everyone that checked in received a card with a button on it. This game is to foster fellowship and to encourage attendees to meet other members they may not know. Next she introduced the Slate of Officers for the VCQ Board which were Karilyn Pittman for Vice President, Constance Chappell Horne for Treasurer, and Lisa Frieman for Membership Coordinator. She then opened nominations from the floor, which there were none put forth. She closed nominations and called for the vote. All slated officers were elected unanimously. She then introduced the board members with their reports.

Vice President: Karilyn Pittman welcomed the 1st time attendees and presented them with a small welcome gift. She then spoke of the VCQ Memory Quilt on display and announced the addition of two new leaves to the quilt in memoriam for Patsy Russo and Rebecca Gail Lane of Covington, VA.

Secretary: Karan Fisher announced the minutes of the June 14, 2025 were published in the August 2025 newsletter and asked for any corrections/amendments. There being none, the minutes stand as published.

Treasurer: Constance Horne reported the financials as of September 30, 2025 as follows: Gross Profit: [REDACTED]; Expenses: \$ [REDACTED]; Money Market: \$ [REDACTED]; Checking: \$ [REDACTED].

Membership: Faye Hannah was not present, however Tammy Halstead provided her report in her stead. There are 356 current members. VCQ membership continues to grow which she accredits to VCQ’s publicity and marketing efforts and to Celebration 2026 registrations.

Historian: Kitty Bull addressed the box of documentation records she has and adding that data into an Excel spreadsheet. Previous spreadsheet data from the early 2000’s could not be recovered but the original documentation records are housed at the Quilt Museum. They are exploring possible grant funding for assistance in transferring the data from the paper quilt documentation days into digital format. She is continuing to sort through the current paper records from the 1990’s to early 2000’s to put on flash drives.

Virtual Programs: Kathleen Hippeli reported that the September 6, 2025 “Scrap-tastic” Virtual Program was a great success and that there were over 40 registrants that attended virtually. The upcoming New Year’s Eve Day Mystery virtual program was announced on September 6, 2025 and registration filled within 24 hours. David Sirota will be presenting his SCRAPPY CHEVRON STAR class. She then invited those present to come forward and give a parade of their SCRAP-TASTIC project from that class. About 20 members paraded their quilt tops/finished quilts and were very well received.

In-Person Programs & Facilities: Jan Farrow welcomed everyone in attendance and was very pleased with the turn-out of membership in support of these in-person meetings. There were 66 registered members, 3 teachers, and 2 teacher helpers. There were 9 no shows/late cancellations. The following are scheduled In-Person meetings for 2026: 3/21/2026 - King of Glory Church in Williamsburg, VA; 6/13/2026 - Blacksburg, VA and 10/17/2026 in Virginia Beach, VA.

Newsletter: Kitty Bull announced that the deadline for the next newsletter is January 15, 2026 for the March 2026 meeting and April 15, 2026 for the June 2026 meeting. She & Mary Grogan would very much appreciate it if you could provide your submission to the newsletter as early as January 10, 2026 and April 10, 2026. Kitty also announced that this is the last year that she & Mary Grogan will be producing the newsletter. She asked that the VCQ Board and the membership seek volunteers to fill that position. She and Mary are willing to support whomever fills this position with putting together the January 2026 newsletter issue.

Web Mistress: Tammy Halstead reported that the new website was set-up last Spring and so far things are working out well. The Tech Team support from a variety of VCQ Board members is strong and appreciated. Tammy asked that if anyone is experiencing difficulty with the website or has updates/changes to information posted on the website (i.e.: new quilt shops/closed quilt shops, quilting events, etc.) to reach out to her via email.

Publicity: Kelly Zuber reported the current rack cards are almost gone and that she will order new replacement rack cards the first of the year 2026. She continues to post VCQ info/events on VCQ Facebook page and other social media sites.

Celebration: Kelly Zuber stated that Celebration 2026 is not too far away and reminded everyone that the final registration payment deadline is February 1, 2026. She has a wait list of registrants, so if final payment is not made these registrants will have an opportunity to fill that vacancy. Karan Fisher is here with the remaining Block Lotto kits for purchase. Kitty Bull has some registration forms for the Quilt Challenge. The Silent Auction at Celebration 2026 is a fund raiser and if you have quality quilting items you wish to contribute, please bring them with you to Celebration 2026 to turn in.

Community Services: Karin McElvin reported that VCQ won 2nd place for all the donated quilts to ALS. She reminded everyone to please label their quilts and to

complete the paperwork on their donation to turn into her with the quilt. She pointed out the ALS table with kits made up and to please take one to make and donate.

Block of the Month: Karen Brewster announced the last BOM posting will be in November on the VCQ website. This BOM project started postings in March 2025 and will remain live on the website through February 1, 2026 at which time it will be taken down. Karen invited all of the members that participated in this BOM project to Show & Tell their quilt at the March 2026 in-person meeting. She hopes there will be a lot of these quilts on display.

Area Reps: No reports provided.
